

MEMORIAL MESSENGER April 2017



The Jews demanded of (Jesus), "What miraculous sign can You show us to prove Your authority to do all this?" Jesus answered them, "Destroy this temple, and I will raise it again in three days."...The temple He had spoken of was His body. After He was raised from the dead, His disciples recalled what He had said." John 2:18-22

Thousands of people heard Jesus claim to be the Son of God, the promised Messiah, the world's Redeemer. But most of those thousands didn't believe what they heard Jesus say. They insisted on visible proof of His deity.

The source of their skepticism is Satan, who wants to create doubt and denial in us, too. He suggests we demand of Jesus, "What miraculous sign can You show us to prove Your authority and divinity? Wouldn't Your Church grow more rapidly if You showed *visible* signs to unbelievers?"

God silences His foe and answers our question with the same tool: His truth. It wasn't just the events of His suffering and death that led His disciples to conclude He is the Savior. It was the written and spoken Word of God about Jesus. The Holy Spirit used the Word, combined with the facts of His dying and rising, to work deeper faith inside the disciples. "After He was raised from the dead, His disciples recalled what He had <u>said</u>."

This month we go spiritually to Holy Week, the high point of the Christian Church year. Will the services the middle of April make the Savior's suffering and death more real to us? The subdued colors and somber songs, the rugged cross in the sanctuary and the banners in the chancel, the black veil and the crown of thorns which will dominate our altar on Good Friday—as well as the solemn silence and the ebbing darkness inside our church—will all serve as visible and audible reminders of His suffering for *our* guilt!

The brilliant whites and the bright lights and the fragrant lilies and the uplifting anthems which will burst all around us Easter morning are also sensory aids to worship. We celebrate Christ's bodily resurrection and the foundation of our faith. He lives! Therefore, we live, too!

But without the clear Word of God to tell us what Jesus has done for us, all of that would be only theatrics. What it finally comes down to is "the Scripture and the words that Jesus has spoken" (John 2:22). We may or may not get an overwhelming feeling from our Holy Week services. But we will most certainly have the Word of our God about the crucified and risen Savior at the center of the Holy Week services, and every service.

We don't look for signs or depend on feelings this holiest time of the year. When people ask us, "How are you feeling?", our answers change depending on, well, how we are feeling! When we ask ourselves, "What happened at the cross and the grave?", the answer is always the same: Jesus died and rose for me! I am saved!

One more thing. The record of our Lord's suffering and death and rising is *not* a secret to be kept hidden among the faithful. Whom will we invite to hear the certainty of salvation with us in the house of risen Son? As the Lord sent His angel to announce to the women at the tomb, so He says to us, "Come and see! Go and tell!"

REQUESTS FOR LIVE NATIVITY ITEMS: The Live Nativity organizers have been in contact with the Board of Stewardship and Evangelism after last year's Live Nativity. We have a few new ideas for this year's Live Nativity. We ask for your help now so that we can be prepared in plenty of time.

We would like to make wrap around, hood-like head coverings for the angels. We will need white material (perhaps fleece would be best) and a few volunteers who are willing to sew these.

We also would like to get 5 canopy, easy set-up tents that are 10'X10' and that would become church property. Each year we have used borrowed tents. While this is greatly appreciated, it has been hard to set them up as marketplace tents because of the different sizes and the different ways they are set up. We would like to be

able to use the same ones every year and be able to have the coverings for the sides all set to place on the tents because we will have the size determined.

Four of these tents will be used for the marketplace and one will be used now for the angels. That tent we would like to have set up with all white sides and lights and tulle on the top. For that, we will now need many white, flat sheets (or similar white fabric); small, white strings of Christmas lights, and fabric like clear tulle that will reflect those lights.

CHURCH COUNCIL REPORTS

PASTOR'S REPORT – There are three eighth grade students in the Catechism Class (along with three seventh grade students). The class is on track to finish the material, as well as get our three eighth grade review sessions in, before confirmation Sunday, May 7th.

WELS news - At the late February Synodical Council (SC) meeting, the SC determined that ministry needs justified greater use of WELS reserve funds, approved the 2017-19 support forecast, and affirmed that a \$3.2 million drawdown of reserves in the Financial Stabilization Fund (FSF) was prudent based on ministry needs and opportunities.

Rev. Mark Schroeder, WELS President, writes, "The FSF still has a healthy balance for the short term,

but the SC recognizes that this level of drawdown is not sustainable in the long term. Inflationary pressures are increasing costs 3.5 percent annually and the SC hopes that congregations, through the efforts of the Conference of Presidents, will increase their CMO by at least that amount annually, so that ministry programs and services do not need to be cut.

The support forecast, which includes CMO, bequests, grants, and gifts, shows a slight improvement over the current year as CMO is planned to grow 0.5 percent annually. In addition, lower than-expected operating and debt retirement costs, plus the gift of a closed congregation's property are projected to increase reserves."

Efforts to secure a guest pastor to conduct our worship services and Bible Class here on Sunday, April 23 have been unsuccessful to date. The Board of Elders is discussing alternatives for those services and the class if a guest pastor is not able to be here that morning,

WELS musician Stephen Bautista, who was here last June, will be traveling through Michigan with his family in October. He has received an open invitation from our congregation, and has expressed his preference to use our school gym for a concert (rather than using the band shell at McCormick Park) because one never knows what the weather will bring.

A special Michigan District Convention will be held at MLS in Saginaw June 5-7. The main reason to have this convention is to prepare Michigan District delegates for the WELS Convention in Watertown, Wisconsin July 31 – August 3.

BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION – The Board of Christian Education recommends that the tuition amounts for the 2017-2018 school year remain unchanged from the 2016-2017 tuition amounts (K-5: \$1,000.00, Pre-School: \$750.00 + \$50.00 non-refundable application fee).

Parent meeting regarding tuition for 2017-2018 school year. Meeting took place on February 15. We received feedback from the parents who attended. There was no firm opposition to increasing tuition. Board is recommending to have tuition rates remain the same for 2017-18. We will formalize a way for school families to submit special gifts, should they do desire, in additional to the regular tuition payments.

Facebook targeted marketing for school reached approximately 37,176 Facebook pages February 20-27 before Preschool and Kindergarten Roundup days. 32 users clicked on the "learn more" link which directed them to our web site. Very cost effective for numbers reached. We thank Laurie Voss for her research and execution of the plan.

We asked at February 15 meeting how non-members heard about us. Most said, "On-line".

One student participated in MLS Fine Arts Fair on March 4.

Preschool license renewal: paperwork completed, waiting for a visit from licensing personnel.

One child and the child's parents attended Preschool Roundup.

We expect five 4-year old preschool students to enroll for kindergarten next year.

MSU Rodeo field trip was very enjoyable.

Seven computers, monitors, keyboards and mice were donated for computer room.

No School April 14 for Good Friday (We will have classes on Monday April 17.)

PTO meets next on Wednesday April 19 at 5:00 pm and will start with a meal.

CMLAL volleyball tournament will be in our gym April 1. PTO help with concessions is needed.

BOARD OF ELDERS – The Board of Elders recommends the transfer of membership for Dawn Pirkel to Immanuel Ev. Lutheran Church in Manitowoc, Wisconsin.

Pastor Voss will not be here for worship services on Sunday, April 23. So far, a guest preacher has not been found. If no guest preacher, is found Rex Hannewald will lead the services, and in that case Holy Communion will not be served at those services.

Our Thursday evening summer worship schedule begins May 25. That Thursday is also the same day as the festival of our Savior's Ascension into heaven. The Board of Elders is considering that Thursday evening service be a preview service of the upcoming Sunday morning service like the rest of our summer Thursday services rather than a separate Ascension festival service.

New Year's Eve is on a Sunday in 2017. The board is considering having only one morning service on that day at 10:00 AM, along with the traditional New Year's Eve service. With a morning service held that day, should our New Year's Eve service be at 4:00 like this past New Year's Eve or at 7:00?

BOARD OF EVANGELISM AND STEWARDSHIP – Facebook marketing for church and school was used before preschool and kindergarten roundup days.

Our website manager has set it up to view the site's analytics.

We discussed promoting Lenten suppers as community dinners. The groups may request reimbursement if collection isn't enough to cover the cost.

We discussed the new greeter schedule and modified greeter guidelines.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES – The newly installed sump pumps are working at church and the parsonage.

We discussed the ongoing water testing. Dave Dawley will be meeting with Ingham County later this month as well as completing the State of Michigan DEQ testings.

New batteries were installed in the thermostat in the storage room, and a new zone damper was installed in the classroom.

Our annual outside cleaning date is set for April 22, 2017 for the church and school. Our board will have a list of projects including power washing the church.

Basketball games were completed on March 5th. We still have teams practicing throughout the week.

FROM OUR PRESCHOOL AND KINDERGARTEN ROOMS: This past month we have been learning about many of the lessons Jesus taught the disciples as He prepared them for His death and departure from our life here on earth. We also learned the events that happened leading up to His death and resurrection. This time of year is so important to reflect on the suffering Jesus went through for all of us. For some of our preschoolers it is their first or second time hearing about what Jesus went through in great detail.
