

MEMORIAL MESSENGER April 2018



"It is finished!" "He is not here; He has risen, just as He said." (John 19:30; Matthew 28:6)

What will happen this time? When the baseball season begins this week, will our team do better or worse than last year? Will the weather stay cold and dry the way it was all March, or will April be warm and wet?

None of us asked, "What will happen this time?" about the life and mission of our Savior as we gathered in His house for six Lent services. Year after year the lessons never change; the ending is ever the same: *crucified*, *died*, *and was buried*. The third day He rose. On a Friday His followers call Good, a young man who was devoted to mankind's good was unjustly executed and placed in another man's grave. Then, before the sun rose the following Sunday, the same man rose from His grave, "just as He said".

So, no surprises are delivered in Lent or during Holy Week. But do we understand what really happened?

When Jesus said, "It is finished!", it wasn't uttered in exhaustion or exasperation. When we say, "It is finished!", we usually mean, "I'm glad that's over." What our Lord really said at the cross was, "It has been perfectly completed!" What our Savior had done was make the perfectly full payment for every sin ever as He suffered hell in our place while He hung there.

That's what really happened at the cross. It wasn't the tragic death of an innocent man – though Jesus was innocent. It was the sacrificial death of our Savior. It was the sacrifice required by God's plan. It was the sacrifice made by God's Son. It was the sacrifice we desperately needed.

An ancient church father scolded the congregation he served, "You do not take the cross seriously because you do not take your sins seriously!" Sin isn't only scandalous conduct. Sin is also our thoughts which don't meet the standard of God's law of love. By that standard, there is always something impure in our motives. How can we ever make up for all of that? We can't! But He did! Perfectly! "It has been perfectly completed!"

We'd have doubts about that if He were still dead. The proof that our Savior did indeed make full payment for our sins is Jesus raising Himself from the dead three days later "just as He said" He would do. The assurance that our holy Father in heaven has accepted His beloved Son's payment for our every sin is God the Father raising God the Son from the dead.

That's what really happened at the grave. It wasn't the correction of a horrible wrong, as though the Father made a mistake in letting Jesus die and then the Father made up for that. It was the triumphant rising of God's Son. It was the victorious statement of God in heaven: "Your sins are covered, dear people! Count on it!"

One could make a case that our Christian faith is summed up in these two Holy Week sentences: "It is finished! He has risen!" It is the truth that is so simple our little children know it and trust it and without shame tell others, "Jesus died for me, then He rose from the dead for me!" It is the truth so powerful that not even Satan himself can mount an argument against it.

We know how it will turn out this time. And we can't wait to hear it again and again and again! See you in God's house this holy weekend! Pastor Voss




<u>THE WALK</u> to our Savior's cross and empty tomb reaches its climax this weekend with a number of special worship services.

SOMETHING NEW FOR SUMMER REFRESHMENTS For one Sunday last summer no families signed up to host a non-Communion Sunday refreshment hour. A few days before that Sunday we sent an email message, asking families to bring a little something for what we called *a potluck refreshment hour*. It was very well received.

The Board of Evangelism & Stewardship has decided that we'll have *a potluck refreshment hour* once during each of the summer months. Here are the dates: *June 3, July 1, and August 5*. On those dates there will be no specific hosts. Instead, we ask each family that heads downstairs for refreshments to bring a little something to eat, sharing it with the others who attend.

The regular summer refreshment dates are June 17, July 15, July 29, August 19, and September 2. In May a sheet will be posted. We will look for several families to can sign up on that sheet to indicate their willingness to provide refreshments for one of those five Sundays.

CHURCH COUNCIL REPORTS

PASTOR'S REPORT – There are three eighth grade students (Leah, Seth and Aaliyah) in the Catechism Class (along with two seventh grade students). The class is on track to finish the material, as well as get our three 8th grade review sessions in, before Confirmation Sunday on May 6.

WELS news – As a result of higher than anticipated Congregation Mission Offerings (CMO) in 2017, the WELS Synodical Council (SC) voted to fund the top three items on the unfunded priority list as adopted by the 2017 synod convention. The SC also received information about 2018 CMO subscriptions, which are lower than the budget adopted for

this fiscal year. The SC will carefully monitor WELS expenses and CMO received throughout the year, and will make budget adjustments if necessary.

Since our preschool roundup and kindergarten roundup happened after the Board of Christian Education met, I'll provide an update here.

Two children who are prospective 3 year old students for our 2018-2019 preschool year attended, and one of them will apply for sure. A few other families have asked for preschool information, but didn't attend. We expect our two current 3 year old students to be enrolled as 4 year old preschoolers in the fall.

Six students were present for kindergarten roundup, and all six will enroll as kindergarten students for 2018-2019. Of those students, 4 are currently in our preschool; 1 is a younger sibling of older students in our school; 1 student attended after his family found information about our school on-line, called to inquire about kindergarten opening for next year, and received our invitation to kindergarten roundup.

The Altar Guild has spoken with the Board of Elders about their desire to purchases new white and green altar paraments since the altar cloths in those colors are quite stained and in poor shape. The new paraments will be paid for by special gifts that the Altar Guild and Ladies Fellowship have given and received.

The Michigan District Convention meets June 11-13 at MLS in Saginaw. Our Board of Elders will contact men from our congregation to serve as our lay delegate.

BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION – Enrollment is unchanged at 25.

A Facebook targeted marketing campaign ran February 28-March 7 to promote preschool and kindergarten roundups. PTO paid \$105. 20,417 people saw the ad with 23 post engagements and 11 link clicks to the website.

PTO purchased software for six computers in our computer room.

Standardized testing will be done in April.

The CMLAL volleyball tournament will be held at our school April 21.

Small school field day is at MLS in Saginaw on May 18.

We remind everyone that VBS has been scheduled for July 23-26.

The Board of Christian Education has discussed the need for a modest tuition increase for the upcoming school year (2018-2019). With much thought and discussion we propose tuition for the 2018-2019 school year to be:

Preschool: \$850, plus a \$50 application for new preschool students (currently it is \$750, with a \$50 application fee)

Kindergarten – Grade 5 for Memorial Ev. Lutheran Church students: \$1000 (currently \$1000)

Kindergarten-Grade 5 for non-Memorial member students: \$1,250 for first child, \$1000 for younger children in same family (currently \$1000 for all non-member children)

BOARD OF ELDERS – The Board of Elders recommends the transfer of membership of Garrett Peckens to Salem Ev. Lutheran Church in Ann Arbor.

Pastor Voss will not be here for worship services April 22. Rex Hannewald will conduct services that day. Holy Communion will not be served at the worship services that Sunday.

The organist schedule and HymnSoft program operator schedule has been set through the end of June.

BOARD OF EVANGELISM AND STEWARDSHIP – Our board urges members to invite family and friends to our special Lent and Holy Week services.

A family event was held Sunday, February 18. We thank several families for the meal after church that day and for organizing the event.

Our board discussed dates for congregation members and friends to go together to a Lugnuts game this summer. The date selected is Saturday, August 11.

Our office secretary makes sure that a link to the most recent WELS Connection video is posted on our congregation's web site once WELS makes the video available (usually the end of the month).

BOARD OF TRUSTEES – Our board recommends the expenditure of not more than \$1750.00 to refinish and recoat the gymnasium floor on or about the first week in June 2018; hiring Floor Care Concepts to perform the work.

Our board recommends spending up to \$650.00 to have the school floor lobby and hallways stripped and waxed the first week in April, over spring break.

Joe Janecke installed LED lighting in the wings of church.

Our board will be working on getting lawn mowers ready, painting handrails at church, and repairing the metal bifold doors in the church kitchen.

Already repaired are the ceiling tiles in the balcony, the dampers in the heating units at school, and resealing around the roof top units at school.

Facility use for the 2017-2018 basketball season: We held 119 games at our facility and grades 1-6 tournament. The season ran from November through February 25. Many thanks to everyone who volunteered their time, talent, energy, and commitment to raise money for our church and PTO.

The spring cleaning date is set for April 7. We will meet at church at 8:00 AM.
