

## MEMORIAL MESSENGER August 2014



Be imitators of God, therefore, as dearly loved children and live a life of love, just as Christ loved us and gave Himself for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God. Ephesians 5:1-2

Do you ride a bike, walk, or run along country roads in the summer? If so, you notice dead animals more with your nose than with your eyes, right? It's one thing to see a dead deer or raccoon or possum on the side of road; it's something else to ride or stride past the spot. The stench of a decaying carcass is almost overpowering—especially in the warm days of summer. A person can't stomach the smell for more than a few moments.

In spite of our culture's attempts to dignify death with beautiful flowers and ornate caskets, death stinks! Death is God's punishment on our world for sin. Death is a powerful way for God to say, "I hate sin! And because all people sin, all people will die!"

Bodily death would have been for all people the final step to eternal suffering in hell. But God stepped forward and did something about our guilt. Jesus agreed to die for us so that we would not be damned forever. He didn't do that because He had to. Jesus didn't mutter, "If nobody else will, I guess I'll *have* to!" Jesus didn't die with a chip on His shoulder. He "loved us and gave himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God". In love for us sinners, Christ wanted to cover our trespasses and their guilt.

Still, we're going to die—unless Judgment Day comes first. But now we view death as passing from this life of sorrow to the life of unending happiness with God. Thanks to Jesus, we know that death isn't the end for us. Leaning on His holy life and trusting in His suffering for us, we will face our last day with courage and joy.

But the sacrificial death of Jesus also has great power for our lives each day *before* we die. Because of what the Savior did for us sinners, we now "live a life of love, just as Christ loved us and gave Himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God". No longer are we covered with the stench of death, but with the holiness of Jesus. No longer does the Father turn away from us in repulsion over our guilt, but He sees us as His children in Jesus. No longer do we live like rotting corpses, but we live in active love for God who saved us.

How does the world see us? How does the Lord look upon our lives each day? Are we more like dead, decaying raccoons in the ditch? Or like the living saints of God—which we are, thanks to God?!? Is our speech sweet-smelling before Jesus? Or are our words full of language that only the devil loves? Do our goals in life reach heaven like a fragrant offering? Or do they smell like death to Him who redeemed us? Does what we value about our existence honor the Lord? Or do our values offend Him?

We've been given the Son of God, along with every needed blessing for life here and hereafter. Our lives will reflect that salvation. "Be imitators of God, therefore, as dearly loved children." The way Jesus gave Himself for us not only paves our road to heaven; it also shows us how we will live each moment until we get there.

Parents, remember that classes at our school dismiss at 12:00 that day, and that our Labor Day recess is both Friday, August 29 and Monday, September 1.


