I lift up my eyes to the hills—where does my help come from? My help comes from the LORD, the Maker of heaven and earth. Psalm 121:1-2



About twenty years ago scientists were salivating about discovery of the human genome. Being able to map a person's DNA, some experts said, would have untold benefits for healing disease and diagnosing illness. But others warned the same information could be used to decide against treatment for a person ("DNA evidence shows that she'll never make it!"), or to promote assisted suicide ("I'm going to get Alzheimer's and die in ten years anyhow; why not end it on my own terms now?!"). Thankfully, we don't hear much about that any more.

Still, one wonders how far the Lord will let science push things. But no matter what technology ultimately develops, it will never change the fact that everything lies under God's perfect control. All things come from, and are ordered by, *"the LORD, the Maker of heaven and earth"*. Your travels around our state again this summer give ample evidence of that as you take in an astounding mix of trees and water and sand and hills and fields and forests. We do well to think often of God's creating and preserving hand.

But we'd be *miserable* creatures surrounded by breathtaking beauty if it weren't for the same God caring most of all about the human soul. Thanks be to Jesus that He came to earth to carry our penalty on the cross where He suffered our punishment of hell. Thanks be to Jesus that He rose from the dead, then ascended into heaven with the words, "Surely I am with you always—to the very end of the age."

Compare that to the prevailing view of the scientific world. Instead of a random act of chance and people in control of their own destiny, God tells us that the universe was formed at His impulse and by His power. Instead of all moving beings existing as related life forms, God tells us that humans are the crown of His creation—given an eternal soul and sent the suffering Savior—and that He wants all people to be saved and to come a knowledge of the truth, *His* truth. Instead of a survival-of-the-fittest world where there is no higher power and no absolute truth, God tells us that He made the plants and animals and annuals for our benefit, and that He made us that we might serve Him in joyful, daily thanks for all His blessings of body and soul.

I doubt that any discovery will lead a large group of scientists to say, "Now I'm convinced that the universe was formed by a mighty deity some six thousand years or so ago!" Many scientists won't accept the Bible's truth about creation because—they say—creation is a matter of faith.

We agree! "By <u>faith</u> we understand that the universe was formed at God's command, so that what is seen was not made out of what was visible" (Hebrews 11:3). But we wish the scientists would see that accepting evolution as explanation for the beginning of things is just as much a matter of faith. In fact, isn't evolution even *more* a matter of faith? Which requires greater faith? Believing that a divine being created all things in six twenty-four days? Or that a one-in-a-trillion chance collision got the evolutionary ball rolling, and that everything just happened to come out well and continues to go pretty well?

You and I will keep trusting that the LORD who created all is the same God who has given us sinners salvation in His Son. That spiritual, eternal help, too, comes from the Maker of heaven and earth, and that is the help we need most and seek day-by-day. *Pastor Voss* **<u>OUR SUMMER WORSHIP SCHEDULE</u>** continues.
