These are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in His name.

John 20:31

A few years before Luther nailed his ninety-five statements to the door of the church in Wittenburg, Germany, Juan Ponce de Leon set sail. Ponce de Leon, who had been with Christopher Columbus on Columbus' famous 1492 voyage, had obtained a royal grant to settle a fabulous island thought to contain a fountain whose waters would restore a person's youth—a fountain of life. Ponce de Leon never found it. Instead, he found Florida.

Ever since mankind was evicted from Eden, folks have been seeking a source of unending life. Some, like Ponce de Leon, have looked for magical water, put their hopes in exotic diets, or turned to medicine. But in spite of so much searching and such extensive experiments, people still grow old and die. Is the search hopeless? Are we doomed to a death from which we'll never wake?

No! We have the source of everlasting life: Jesus! John wrote near the end of his gospel, "these (words) are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may life in His name". How appropriate that in two of our orders of service we sing that very passage following Bible readings that tell us about everlasting life! Jesus, the One of whom John wrote said, "God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16). Jesus, the One of whom John wrote paid the price for us when He took our hell upon Himself.

Do you *want* to live forever? Many would answer emphatically, "No way! Not with evil and corruption, sadness and sickness, pain and hunger, arguing and fighting around me every day! Deal with that forever? No thanks!" But what if they found out that everlasting life is filled with love, peace, and joy in the presence of God? Their answer would change. We know that everlasting life will be wonderful—even more precious than we can imagine. In fact, we already have everlasting life through faith in Christ; we're just not in heaven yet.

As our Lutheran Elementary School and Preschool classes resume at the end of August, as Sunday School and Bible Class sessions start up again September 10, we will join our children and grandchildren in being reminded that God knows our sins—and calls for everlasting *destruction* because of them. We will join our children and grandchildren in also hearing that God's love in Jesus provides forgiveness for every sin.

That everlasting life doesn't come in sporadic spurts or by blind luck or out of the clear blue. Everlasting life is won by the greatest price ever paid: the life and death of Jesus for us. Everlasting life is dispensed by God through His means of grace: the Word and sacraments—the fountains from which flows everlasting life! How often this summer have we stopped our projects (or even while on vacation) to drink from what God provides? How often do we intend to drink His wonderful water of life next month?

We don't need a fountain of youth. We have the fountain of life! Drink from Him and live forever!

Please look for information to be sent later this month.




