When the time had fully come, God sent His son, born of a woman, born under law, to redeem those under law, that we might receive the full rights of sons." Galatians 4:4-5

Some suggest that this will be a dismal Christmas. Why? Because Thanksgiving falls almost as late as it possibly can, they're worried that it will be a much shorter shopping season with much lower sales.

Genuine Christmas children don't let calendars short-circuit their Christmas preparations. Believers who count God's Son as the greatest Gift are able to filter out all that would get in the way of that Gift. A *dismal* Christmas? There's no such thing!

To capture the joy of the true Christmas, picture your family as faithful people of God living in Israel at the time our Savior was born in Bethlehem. Would the news of higher taxes imposed by the Romans cancel your joy at the news of the shepherds, "The Son of God has come to us!"? Would the threat of a collapsing financial market have dampened the glory of knowing that a heavenly visitor was among you in the form of a baby boy? Would anything at all have been able to rob you of the certainty that God's promises were fulfilled?

Our King came to our world at His own perfect time in history. He came born of an ordinary, sinful woman. He came to live "under law" perfectly in order to be our holiness. All of that is wrapped inside the strips of cloth that we will view in faith the end of the month.

Let retail merchants wring their hands about holiday buying; we lift our hands in praise to God that He has come through on His plan to save us. Let stores insist that we need their merchandise to make it a merry Christmas; we will fill ourselves with God's Word of life to make ours a *blessed* Christmas. Let financial experts advise that we can't be sure how the world markets will react to terror in the Middle East; we will continue to be the most confident, the most well-adjusted, the most satisfied souls on earth because we know that our inheritance in heaven is guaranteed.

This is the Christmas for which we'll spend the next three and one-half weeks preparing: at just the right time God sent His Son to earth to take on our flesh and blood so that our sins would be forgiven forever. No snow, no trees, no ribbon or bows, no festive dinners or family gatherings. Above all, the Savior from sin. There's nothing wrong with our Christmas traditions—unless any of them get in the way of our Redeemer.

This month, take time daily for quiet reflection on the real Christmas. Our midweek Advent services offer an excellent opportunity to do just that. So does reviewing your children's Bible lessons and memory work and Christmas Eve service parts and songs. All of it is so familiar; yet all of it is so wonderfully gracious and new. For a few minutes each day this Advent make the effort to shut out all that doesn't matter and ponder these eight great words of Christmas: *God sent His son, born of a woman.* That is God's recipe for a blessed Christmas!



CHURCH COUNCIL REPORTS

PASTOR'S REPORT – We have decided to try two Christmas Eve service rehearsals this December. (See more elsewhere in the newsletter.)

I will be here for the first Advent service on December 3, then travel the next two Wednesdays to conduct the services at area WELS churches while the pastors of those congregations conduct the services here.

WELS update: The Synodical Council (SC) meets this month. The SC had directed the areas of ministry to plan for a "no increase" budget earlier this year. The president's office, along with the President's Advisory Council, then adopted an overall plan last month. That plan will be presented to the SC for consideration at this meeting. The plan still will be able to be adjusted in the coming months (depending on funding available from Congregation Mission Offerings and other sources). A final recommendation will be adopted by the SC in February.

There is more good news about Congregation Mission Offerings (CMO). Mission offerings from congregations are continuing at a strong and encouraging pace. October offerings were very strong with an increase of 8.4% over 2013 and \$321,000 more than projected for the month of October. Year-to-date CMO is up 3.1% over 2013 and \$451,000 over projections. Once again, the Lord has moved His people to respond to His grace with generous thank offerings. We thank Him, and we thank God's people for their faithfulness in supporting our work as a synod.

BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION – *Mornings with Mommy* was not held in October or November due to Karla's maternity leave. The next one is scheduled for December 18.

We had an inquiry about preschool in September for a child to start in January. Karla and Pastor Voss will follow up.

Background checks have been completed for our aides.

We thank Laurie Voss for substitute teaching while Judy was away for a family funeral.

A Williamston public school speech therapist has been working with one of our students at our school. We appreciate the working relationship we have with them for special situations.

Mrs. Bater's last day teaching at our school was November 6. We are very appreciative of her hard work keeping Karla's class running smoothly in Karla's absence. She has been a blessing to our school. We welcome Mrs. Leitz back!

The next PTO meeting is January 21, 2015.

Board discussion took place based on comments at the last voters meeting concerning closing the school due to declining enrollment. The Board of Christian Education remains committed to keeping the school open and providing the best possible Christ centered education. We continue to promote the school and look for ways to increase the enrollment.

BOARD OF ELDERS – The Board of Elders recommends the transfer of membership of David and Becky Shuler, David Jr., and Corbin from Shepherd of the Hills Ev. Lutheran Church in Lansing to Memorial Ev. Lutheran Church.

The Elders continue to seek alternatives when a guest preacher cannot be secured. Our first choice would be the possibility of getting a recorded sermon on DVD from a sister congregation. Utilizing a smart phone to live stream a sermon would likely be very costly (date usage) and could have buffering issues.

Nancy Hart presented good information to the Board of Elders from her attendance at the WELS National Worship Conference.

BOARD OF EVANGELISM AND STEWARDSHIP – Website issues: Internet reliability at school remains an issue. Frontier was at school in mid-October and could not find a problem. Laurie Voss will keep a log of when internet goes out or has troubles.

We discussed live streaming sermons at church if Pastor is not available. We will look into the issue and determine if we have the capability.

The Williamston Light Parade is December 6th. Work has been done on the float entry. We are looking for volunteers to walk along with the float and hand out invitations for our Christmas services and the Live Nativity.

We thank Clark Collins for work on the third quarter thankoffering statements. The 2015 counter schedule will be prepared soon. 2015 thankoffering envelopes have been delivered.

We will renew the WELS Connection videos for 2015 and will purchase DVDs. The cost has not yet been announced, but for 2014 it was \$105.

We have been asked to add Debt Retirement to the special gift fund list.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES – We will contact Dave Wood to check the snow blowers and have them ready for the winter.

We prioritized the deferred maintenance/wish list as directed:

- a) Replacing or rebuilding the heating units at school; contacted Myers Plumbing and Heating to inspect and provide a proposal based on their recommendations.
- b) Replace the shingled roof at school with a new metal roof. Replace roof on garage and pavilion with either metal roof or shingles.
- c) Snow blower for church and parsonage
- d) Replace the driveway at the church parsonage. Our board feels with the small size of the driveway, our church members should be able to complete this project in the spring/summer of 2015.
- e) Spartan glass is getting us a proposal for replacing the doors at the north end of the school.
