


# MEMORIAL MESSENGER December 2015

"What I want for Christmas is ..."



Children will say that a lot this month. Adults will, too—especially when prompted by their spouse. I won't bore you with my gift list. But I urge you to join me in making a number of Christmas *wants* and *wishes*.

I want to outlaw the use of Christian Christmas hymns to sell merchandise. Doesn't it rub us the wrong way to hear companies trying to sell Smartphones while someone slyly sings *Hark! The Herald Angels Ring*? Don't we dislike hearing big box stores shouting about their great deals while *Joy to the World* plays in the background, as though the great joy of the season is huge savings on new gadgets?

I wish that "Merry Christmas!" wouldn't be used instead of "Goodbye!" each time a visit or conversation ends this month. What I really want for Christmas is that we Christians wish our friends and loved ones "May yours be a blessed Christmas!", thereby setting a spiritual tone for this special season to celebrate the Savior's birth.

I wish that there would be no countdown of shopping days left until Christmas. Wouldn't it be wonderful if everyone realized that there's something far more important than packing our family life full of earthly traditions? I wish that people would understand that they don't need to race around to make Christmas special.

I wish that we could take Christmas out of the stores and center it in our homes. What a blessings for fathers and mothers to read with their children at home the Old Testament promises of the Savior's coming, and then the Luke 2 fulfillment of the Savior come to earth! How sad that too many parents don't give that a second thought, but plan weeks in advance to get their kids to the mall to sit on a fairy tale character's lap.

I wish that our Christmas will be what the Christian poet pictured: a silent, holy night. Wouldn't it be refreshing to hear the world speak in whispered awe about our newborn King Jesus, rather than to have the world blast us with tales of sales and with flashing colored lights? *Christ the Savior is born!* Isn't that what we want most?

I want Christmas to slow down, not race past in a blur of parties, gifts, and visits. I want to ponder and treasure what God has sent for us sinners. I want to hear about and to have in heart the excitement the shepherds felt the first Christmas. I want all of us to thrill at the only Gift we need: the Gift from heaven, the Savior, Jesus.

I'm no Scrooge. Wanting earthly gifts for Christmas isn't wrong. But the heart of Christmas isn't *earthly* gifts; it isn't kind feelings. The heart of Christmas is that God came to earth so that His verse above would be fulfilled. "The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not be in want." Because Jesus came, I have all I need in Him!

I want our December to be more spiritual than commercial. I want us to hear the message that saves souls. We'll attend the extra worship services held at church this month. The Word is how the Holy Spirit blesses our Advent preparation for and anticipation of the Savior's birth. The Word is how the Holy Spirit makes Christ and His work more real than ever to us.

Finally, my wife and I want and wish for you and your family that yours will be a truly blessed Christmas!



By having a supper before the service, we hope that more members will come here for a meal and then to be fed with God's Word as we prepare to celebrate our Savior's birth.

<u>CHILDREN'S CHRISTMAS EVE SERVICE REHEARSALS</u> The children of our congregation will gather at church on *Saturdays*, *December 12 and 19* from 9:30 - 11:30 AM.

Parents, for the children are to proclaim God's Word on Christmas Eve in word and song effectively, their attendance at these rehearsals are very important. Please plan now to have your children here those two mornings. If your child must miss a rehearsal, please speak with Pastor Voss ahead of time.

We expect all children of the congregation to participate in the service (from those who attend the preschool level of our Sunday School through children who are in 8th grade.)

If travel plans will keep your child from being here Christmas Eve, please mention it to Pastor Voss as soon as you are aware of the conflict so that the necessary changes can be made in service assignments.

**LEARNING SONGS FOR CHRISTMAS EVE** Parents, the Sunday School session each week begins with music and a brief devotion. In December, the music will include songs that the children will sing for the Christmas Eve service.

Bring your children to Sunday School regularly so that they can learn about what God has done to save sinners, while you come upstairs to do the same in our Bible Class! Please have your children here for the start of Sunday School each week so that they can participate in the music portion and hear the devotion.

# CHURCH COUNCIL REPORTS

**PASTOR'S REPORT** – **WELS News** – WELS has already received some gifts marked for the *One in Christ* WELS debt elimination thankoffering. Our congregation received information about that thankoffering on November 22.

The organ repairman was here on October 22, at our request. He did not charge us for the service call. He

spent almost two hours here, but only charged us for one hour of labor (\$90) and for a \$16.90 part. He tried to clean contacts to see if that would fix the popping noise; it didn't. He narrowed the problem down to a failing module, and to the necessity to re-solder and tighten all amplifier module connections. Because the problem was not in the module replaced previously (which he had said would be a repair for which there would be no charge), he felt it was fair to charge us for some of his labor and for a new part.

The schedule for midweek Advent services with area WELS congregations has not yet been finalized. However, I expect that I'll be here for the first service on December 2, then travel the next two Wednesdays to conduct the services at area WELS churches while the pastor of the congregation I am at conducts the service here that evening.

**BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION** – We began discussions on setting tuition and fees for the 2016-2017 school year.

The board thanks our school library volunteers for their faithful service.

The vent/register unit in the library needs fixing, a new transformer part has been ordered.

The PTO will host the first midweek Advent service supper on Wednesday, December 2.

**BOARD OF ELDERS** – The Elders reviewed the upcoming special worship services.

The Elders continued to discuss the logistics of our Christmas Eve candle lit service.

We will order an Automated External Defibrillator for placement in our church building.

New choir music has been ordered. Our board asks the choir director to request reimbursement for this purchase.

Our annual December door offering will be Sundays, December 13 and 20. Money received in this special thankoffering will be sent to support Shepherd of the Lakes Ev. Lutheran Church, the new WELS mission in Fenton, MI.

**BOARD OF EVANGELISM AND STEWARDSHIP** – Donated wire was run to the school office computer by volunteers. Internet connectivity has not been an issue in the office since this was performed. We thank those who donated and volunteered to run the wire from the computer room to the office, and soon to our classrooms.

We are looking into providing CPR training for our members and community.

Financial planning seminar will be held February 28, 2016 by Pastor Kenyon.

Festival of Lights parade will be December 5. We discussed making preparations for preparing the float, tow vehicle and getting volunteers in costume to hand out invitations.

The Live Nativity will be December 12. The plan is to keep things the same with the event, except the wise men may not be included this year.

Thanks to Clark Collins for distributing the Third Quarter thankoffering statements. 2016 envelopes will be distributed on December 19.

We discussed candidates for open board positions. We have some candidates, and we will request a special voters meeting before Christmas.

We discussed Advent suppers. PTO will host the first supper. Volunteers will do the second supper, and the Ladies' Fellowship will host the third supper.

We will renew the WELS Connection for 2016.
