"You are to give Him the name Jesus, because He will save His people from their sins." Matthew 1:21



You arrive early to get a good seat for the movie you've waited weeks to see, then someone quite tall sits in the row right in front of you. Though the theater has a sloping floor, you have to lean to the right then the left to see the screen. You want to say, "Hey,

you're in my way! I can't see very well! Please sit somewhere else!"

That will happen to us spiritually these weeks before we celebrate the birth of the Son of God. So much of what our society does this month gets in the way of the *real* Christmas. Presents to buy, parties to plan and/or attend, cards to send, trees to trim, decorations to hang. Those threaten to block our view of the real Christmas.

None of those are sinful in themselves. But anything that gets in our way of seeing who Jesus is, remembering what Jesus has done, trusting where Jesus will take us is something to limit—or eliminate. As we prepare our homes for the season we are just as diligent to prepare our hearts for the Savior. Jesus didn't come to earth as a little baby to be adored (though He was adored by shepherds, Magi, Simeon, Anna); He came to be the God of forgiveness. Jesus didn't enter our world to be a good example (though He was a good example every day He walked and talked among the people); He came to live a sinless life in our place and to carry our hell on Himself at the cross.

Those thoughts aren't found on most Christmas cards or captured in many songs of the season. But those truths are the real Christmas. God made sure Joseph knew those truths before Jesus was born. His message to Joseph through the angel was, "You are to give Him the name Jesus, because He will save His people from their sins." We want our Christmas guests to feel wonderfully welcome in our homes for Christmas. But if Jesus and the forgiveness of sins He came to deliver isn't the center of our Christmas, our Christmas isn't real.

Those who get the real Christmas are those looking for the Savior from sin. What good news the Messiah's birth was to the shepherds and the Magi! The real Christmas isn't a feeling or a season. During the evening worship services this month, we'll review our lives and our sins and long for the Savior's forgiveness. That's the real Advent and Christmas. During our home devotions around the Word (and maybe with an Advent wreath), we'll ponder the mission for which Christ came to earth and how successfully He completed it and what it means for us sinners. That's the real Advent and Christmas.

Enjoy the season. But don't hesitate to say to some things this month, "Get out of my way! I can't see the Savior!" May the real Advent and Christmas truth fill your home and heart! May the Savior grant you a truly blessed Advent and Christmas!

<u>CHILDREN'S CHRISTMAS EVE SERVICE REHEARSALS</u> The children of our congregation will gather at church on *Saturdays*, *December 10 and 17* from 9:30 - 11:30 AM. There may also be a rehearsal on *December 6* at the same time.

Parents, for the children are to proclaim God's Word on Christmas Eve in word and song effectively, their attendance at these rehearsals are very important. Please plan now to have your children here those two mornings. If your child must miss a rehearsal, please speak with Pastor Voss ahead of time.

We expect all children of the congregation to participate in the service (from those who attend the preschool level of our Sunday School through children who are in 8th grade.)

If travel plans will keep your child from being here Christmas Eve, please mention it to Pastor Voss as soon as you are aware of the conflict so that the necessary changes can be made in service assignments.

LUNCH FOR CHILDREN AND THEIR FAMILIES Our Sunday School teachers are once again providing a lunch for the children and their families *after the December 10 rehearsal*. The meal will begin at 11:30. We hope that all the children and their family members will join us!

<u>LEARNING SONGS FOR CHRISTMAS EVE</u> Parents, the Sunday School session each week begins with music and a brief devotion. In November and December, the music is including songs that the children will sing for the Christmas Eve service.

Bring your children to Sunday School regularly so that they can learn about what God has done to save sinners, while you come upstairs to do the same in our Bible Class! Please have your children here for the start of Sunday School each week so that they can participate in the music portion and hear the devotion.

CHURCH COUNCIL REPORTS

PASTOR'S REPORT – WELS news: Through October WELS Congregation Mission Offerings totaled \$16,148,683. That's about \$80,000 more than the first 10 months of 2015. It's also nearly \$340,000 above 2016 subscriptions (when pro-rated for 10 months). We thank the Lord for moving His people to bring these thankofferings. The Michigan District portion of those mission thankofferings is above last year's levels and above what the 10-month subscription is for our district. It has also been reported that the WELS debt is almost entirely eliminated, as a result of special gifts to WELS the past 12 months, and a \$1.6 million payment from this year's WELS budget.

WELS Christian Aid and Relief is assisting with money donations and volunteer labor congregations and families in Louisiana and the Carolinas affected by flooding when hurricanes passed near those areas.

The schedule for midweek Advent services with area WELS congregations has not yet been finalized. However, I expect that I'll be here for the first service on November 30, then travel the next two Wednesdays to conduct the services at area WELS churches while the pastor of the congregation I am at conducts the service here that evening.

BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION – Enrollment: Figures are the same, though one four year old moved and one four year old enrolled.

Tardy policy is working; students and parents are aware of expectations and consequences.

The board thanks Denis and Nancy Hart and all of our hot lunch helpers.

The board thanks our library volunteers for their wonderful work.

PTO will host supper at church Wednesday, November 30 and Wednesday March 1.

We discussed having 2 Sundays off for Sunday School for the Christmas and New Year's holidays each year.

We will ask individuals to serve as Sunday School substitute teachers.

BOARD OF ELDERS – The Board of Elders recommends changing the summer evening worship schedule for 2017, switching from Monday evenings to Thursday evenings at 7:00.

The Board of Elders have set the time for the upcoming New Year's Eve service this year. The service will be at 4:00 PM.

The Elders reviewed the summer worship schedule. With holidays and other circumstances it seems the Monday services get canceled or re-scheduled more frequently than the Thursday evening services in the past. Therefore in an effort to maintain a more consistent worship schedule we recommend discontinuing the Monday services, and resume the Thursday evening services next summer.

As has been our tradition, we will again receive our annual December door offering this year. The dates the door offering will be received will be December 11 and 18. The board has designated Michigan Lutheran Seminary in Saginaw as the recipient of our door offering.

BOARD OF EVANGELISM AND STEWARDSHIP – We have a note in the bulletin to like our Facebook page, and we encourage members to use Facebook to promote Advent/Christmas services and the Live Nativity.

Another community dinner will be planned for some time after January 1.

We will distribute WELS DVDs at Thanksgiving, Advent, and Christmas services.

We thank Dan Kasischke for getting the third quarter statements out. He will prepare the 2017 thankoffering envelopes for distribution by December 18.

We will have a float in the Williamston Light Parade on December 3, and we ask member to walk the parade route in Live Nativity costumes and distribute flyers about our Christmas worship services and the Live Nativity.

Advent suppers are set: November 30 – PTO; December 7 – Board of Evangelism and Stewardship; December 14 – Ladies' Fellowship.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES – The heating system at the school has been turned on. We will get new filters installed shortly. Filters in the church and parsonage have been replaced already.

Snow throwers are ready for service.

The eaves trough on the east side of school has been repaired and redesigned.

Church ceiling tiles in the balcony will be looked at.
