

# MEMORIAL MESSENGER December 2018



Prepare the way for the LORD, make straight paths for Him. Every valley shall be filled in, every mountain and hill made low. The crooked roads shall become straight, the rough ways smooth. And all mankind will see God's salvation. Luke 3:4-6

Advent is considered by some the ugly duckling of the church year. Folks want to rush right from Thanksgiving meals to Christmas traditions. There's nothing wrong with that. But the sad result of that is considering Christmas to be over by December 25, instead of just beginning.

As children of God we will spend the weeks before Christmas not just following traditions of the season, but preparing for the arrival of the Savior – the *real* Christmas. That Advent preparation includes pondering individually, as a family, as a congregation *why* the Savior was born in Bethlehem. He came to cover our guilt. The weeks leading up to Christmas are spent in repentance for our sins, and in reflection on God's love that moved Him to shower His grace in Jesus on us undeserving sinners. Advent messages from the Old Testament prophets and from John the Baptist hold those truths before us.

It's not popular during the world's holiday season to focus on our sins and our desperate condition. But it's the proper thing for God's people to do. When we feel more deeply our need for the Savior, we will receive more sweetly the message that He has come as promised to rescue us. When we level the mounds in our heart of self-centered pride, fill in the ruts of shameful sins, straighten the dangerous curves of worldly temptations, we do what God has urged His people for centuries to do in preparing for the Savior. Then God's good news of great joy will fill our hearts, "The Savior has been born for you!"

It's not wrong to enjoy holiday lights and events and music – even gift shopping. These, too, are delights God has given us. But let none of that become more important to us than God's calls to repent and to trust, to prepare hearts and lives for Him who came once in humility to save us and who will come again in glory to get us.

As December moves along, maybe you'll wish time could slow down so you can enjoy the holiday season. The emphasis of the Christian Advent season is precisely that! At our special midweek services, regular Sunday services, and daily devotions at home, the Holy Spirit puts us in the sandals of Old Testament believers as we ponder what it was like to wait for the Savior to be born. That's how God will bless our Advent preparation, and then our real Christmas celebration!

<u>CHILDREN'S CHRISTMAS EVE SERVICE REHEARSALS</u> The children of our congregation will gather at church on *Saturdays, December 15 and 22* from 9:30 - 11:30 AM.

Parents, for the children are to proclaim God's Word on Christmas Eve in word and song effectively, their attendance at these rehearsals are very important. Please plan now to have your children here those two mornings. If your child must miss a rehearsal, please speak with Pastor Voss ahead of time.

We expect all children of the congregation to participate in the service (from those who attend the preschool level of our Sunday School through children who are in 8th grade.)

If travel plans will keep your child from being here Christmas Eve, please mention it to Pastor Voss as soon as you are aware of the conflict so that the necessary changes can be made in service assignments.

<u>LEARNING SONGS FOR CHRISTMAS EVE</u> Parents, the Sunday School session each week begins with music and a brief devotion. In November and December, the music will include songs that the children will sing for the Christmas Eve service.

Bring your children to Sunday School regularly so that they can learn about what God has done to save sinners, while you come upstairs to do the same in our Bible Class! Please have your children here for the start of Sunday School each week so that they can participate in the music portion and hear the devotion.

<u>LUNCH FOR CHILDREN AND THEIR FAMILIES</u> Our Sunday School staff is once again providing a lunch for the children and their families. This year the special lunch will be **after the December 15 rehearsal**. The meal will begin at 11:30. We hope that all the participating children and their family members will join us!

**THE LADIES FELLOWSHIP GROUP** In December we have several activities planned. Our annual Christmas party is Monday, **December 3** at 7:00. We will share our favorite Christmas appetizer or dessert, visit and play a few fun games. Don't forget your wrapped White Elephant gift. (We've chosen to have them be useful.)

We will decorate the church for Advent the next day, Tuesday morning, **December 4** at 9:00 AM. After all that, we will host the congregational Advent supper on **December 12.** We have been working on a tasty menu for that meal.

<u>CHOIR</u> rehearsals have resume. We meet *Thursdays at 7:30* and are practicing numbers for our choral service on December 23.

## CHURCH COUNCIL REPORTS

**PASTOR'S REPORT** – I am conducting Bible Instruction Classes with two prospects. Their respective schedules and preferences make it best to have separate classes, rather than combining them in one class.

**WELS news** Congregation Mission Offerings through the end of October across WELS are about \$375,000 behind last year at the same time, and are just about at the level of the prorated subscribed amount for 2018. Michigan District congregations have sent WELS \$1,686,739, which is \$14,000 ahead of last year at the same time, and about \$80,000 ahead of the district's prorated subscribed amount for 2018.

As a result of the CMO not increasing, the Synodical Council (SC) will consider at its February meeting adjusting spending levels so that the Financial Stabilization Fund does not dip any lower than the \$10,000,000, an amount that a WELS Convention decision set some years ago to help the Synod weather financial fluctuations.

I will be here for the first midweek Advent service on December 5, then travel for the next two Wednesdays to conduct the services at our WELS churches in Dexter and Grass Lake, while the pastor of the congregation I am at conducts the service here that evening.

**BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION** – First Quarter report cards were prepared and Parent - Teacher conferences held.

With 3 in 5th grade and 8 in Kindergarten this year, if nothing changes, Mrs. Domke will have 25 students next year. Faculty has talked about classroom duties being shared to some degree next year.

ACT testing materials (Grades 3-5) will be ordered before the December 31 deadline for April 2019 testing.

The board thanks Laurie Voss for taking student pictures and sending them to our parents by email.

Christmas vacation will be December 24-January 24 which is the same as most area public schools.

PTO will host the Advent supper on December 5 and the Lent supper on March 6.

There will be no Sunday School or Bible Class on December 23 and December 30.

**BOARD OF ELDERS** – We have a new communion flagon. The cross on top of the old flagon has broken off several times, and the plating on the inside of the flagon is starting to deteriorate. Thanks to a special gift, a new stainless steel flagon has been purchased.

The Elders discussed the upcoming special services. We will have one service with Communion on Sunday, December 23 at 10:00 AM and one service on Sunday, December 30 at 10:0 AM. The Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, and New Year's Eve services will be held at the same times as in previous years.

New white and green paraments have been ordered and will arrive in mid-December. The paraments are being paid for by the Ladies Fellowship Group and special gifts.

Our annual December door offering will be taken December 16 and 23. The Elders are discussing which WELS charity/mission field to support with the offering.

**BOARD OF EVANGELISM AND STEWARDSHIP** – We discussed the Live Nativity and decided that because of lack of volunteers to set up before the event, we will not have it this year.

The office secretary has put a link to SignUp Genius for basketball games on web site.

A new greeters schedule has been prepared and distributed.

The Ladies Fellowship will try to have a pancake meal in March at school.

We discussed a Trunk or Treat event and will look more into this for next year.

Advent suppers are set: December 5 – PTO; December 12 – Ladies Fellowship; December 19 – If no hosts, Board of Evangelism and Stewardship.

**BOARD OF TRUSTEES** – Myer's Plumbing and Heating was contacted for a service call due at School due to no heat in the offices and classrooms (older section of School).

Thank you to Victor Domke for the number of tedious hours spent resealing and replacing gaskets on the School's roof heating and cooling units (to prevent leaking).

Due to deteriorated condition, the tables under the School pavilion will be removed and disposed.

Basketball games have resumed as of Saturday, November 10 and continue through March 2019. Volunteer help is most appreciated.

The Church cleaning schedule will be updated and the new schedule will begin in January.

The parsonage dishwasher needs new dish racks. Due to the age of the dishwasher and cost for replacement dish racks, the dishwasher will be replaced when funds are available.

We discussed snow removal for the upcoming months.

Thank you to the family for the donation for usage of a snow blower and generator.

It was brought to the Trustees' attention that a power door is needed to assist with entering church from the top of the ramp. Discussion followed regarding logistics and cost. We are researching further.
