"We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to his own way; and the LORD has laid on Him the iniquity of us all." (Isaiah 53:6) "Look, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!" (John 1:29)

A coach sends substitutes into a game for a lot of reasons—other than the wholesome goal to get most of the players into each game. One player gets tired, another is mismatched against the opponent, still another tweaks an ankle, and yet another is having a bad game.

You are familiar with John the Baptist's explanation of the heavenly Father's substitution. John pointed to Jesus and proclaimed, "Look, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!" The upcoming Lenten season is all about substitution. In the midweek services which begin Ash Wednesday, February 18, the subdued hymn tunes, the different colors in our worship area, the Scripture lessons and sermons will all direct our attention to history's most important substitution: Christ for us sinners.

Why did the LORD send the Substitute in our place? Were we tired or injured? I suppose that our spiritual condition could be described that way. But such a description would minimize our damning guilt. God's Word, especially the Isaiah verse above, says it less diplomatically, but far more accurately. "Each of us has turned to his own way", which God goes on to describe as "the iniquity of us all".


The LORD sent the Substitute in our place because we couldn't get the job done. What job? The demand that we keep God's law *perfectly*. God doesn't settle for us doing our best; He leaves no room for error. "*Be perfect...as your heavenly Father is perfect*" (Matthew 5:48). We needed the Substitute because we were headed for certain defeat if left to ourselves. And that defeat would result in our damnation.

Jesus came—not off the bench, but from heaven—to be our saving Substitute. A challenge each Lenten season is that we not narrow our focus on the cross to the fact that there Jesus died a cruel, gruesome death. May the Holy Spirit use His Word to hold before us the saving fact that Christ at the cross—after His perfect life—suffered the torture and torments of hell for every sin. The torture of hell was the punishment we should have paid by suffering forever there. Thanks to our Substitute, we'll never have to spend a second there!

During Holy Week this year, many will be talking about college basketball's Final Four games. What we need to hear about that week—and all our lives—isn't what a coach did by changing his lineup to turn the season around, but what God did by suffering in our place to forgive us now and take us to Himself forever.

May Spirit-worked, humble repentance and joy move us to hear God's Word in the extra services coming up. May our Substitute continue to take His rightful place at the center of our hearts and at the head of our lives!

CHURCH COUNCIL REPORTS

PASTOR'S REPORT – The officers of the Michigan District will be meeting in the Toledo area February 2-5 (a meeting in connection with the semi-annual meeting of the district's officers and circuit pastors).

It seemed to work well to have 2 Christmas Eve service rehearsals last month, instead of the 3 that have been held most previous years. We'll likely follow that rehearsal schedule for December 2015. We thank our teachers in Sunday School and in our school's classrooms, as well as our parents, for working with the children to prepare to proclaim in word and song the Christmas truth of the birth of the Savior.

WELS news: WELS congregations continue to submit the figure for their 2015 WELS Congregation Mission Offering (CMO) commitment, with a deadline of February 1. The WELS Synodical Council (SC) will meet later in February. The SC, based on what WELS congregations have submitted for 2015 CMO commitments, will decide at that meeting if adjustments need to be made for the balance of this fiscal year's budget and will finalize its proposed budget for 2015-16 and 2016-17 to present to WELS Convention delegates in late July at Michigan Lutheran Seminary.

BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION – We are seeking updated photos of school-related activities to run as a slide show at weekend basketball games.

We reviewed the proposed school calendar for 2015-16.

BOARD OF ELDERS – The Board of Elders recommends the transfer of membership of Aron Dawley to Memorial Ev. Lutheran Church.

The Board of Elders recommends increasing the guest preacher compensation rate to \$100.00 for one service, \$120.00 for two services and \$50 for Bible Class.

We will renew our congregation's annual license with 2 copyright companies (for our electronic copy of *Christian Worship: Supplement*) this month.

Our annual December door offering has been sent to Christo Palabra da Vide in Detroit.

BOARD OF EVANGELISM AND STEWARDSHIP – We organized the board as follows: Joe Janecke-chairman and Andy Rusnak-secretary.

We discussed the Live Nativity and parade. Approximately 325-350 people attended the Live Nativity and one family came to our Christmas service as a result. We thank all organizers and volunteers for putting together the Live Nativity and parade.

The Financial Planning seminar was postponed due to Pastor Kenyon's illness.

We thank Clark Collins for distributing the 2014 thankoffering statements.

A bowling outing well be scheduled for April 4th.

We have a nominee for a position on the Board of Christian Education. We plan to hold an election at the January 27th voters' meeting instead of calling a special voters' meeting for the election.

We discussed Lent suppers. We expect to have 3 of the six evenings covered and are looking for additional volunteers.

An audit of the church financial records will be conducted soon.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES – Laurie Voss presented and discussed the various options available for the church/school copier. Our current contract expires on 2/15/2015. Our board thanks Laurie for all of her efforts. Based on the proposals we are recommending that we purchase our existing copier from Hasselbring Clark Company for \$1.00 and enter into a maintenance agreement for the copier at a cost of \$1,072.00 annually.

Board reorganization: We welcome to our board David Dawley. Todd Loeffler-chairman; Victor Domke and David Dawley-school items; Pat Crandall-parsonage items; Bruce Painter-church related items; Dennis Fisher-secretary.

A new snow blower has been purchased and is stored in the parsonage garage.

David Dawley is going to check with a vocational electronics school to see if they would be interested in our old electronic items.

We are still looking into a proposal for installing metal roofing systems at the school, office, garage and pavilion.

We are also looking at getting a proposal for installing an LED lighting system in the gym area at school.

Victor and Kendall did some extensive work on getting the lift pump station at school operational. Many thanks!

Our board has contacted Spartan Glass to install a new north door at school and we asked for a proposal to move the lobby vestibule wall in 18 inches.

Thank you to those people who helped out by installing weather stripping, sealing up cracks, moving snow and keeping our property maintained.
