

# MEMORIAL MESSENGER February 2017

The Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many. Matt. 20:28

The energetic college student stands by your table and says, "My name is Ralph, and I'll be your server!" What do you expect Ralph to bring you? What *you* want to eat and drink? Or what *he* wants you to eat and drink? If he brings you the latter, Ralph won't get much of a tip, will he?

Like people of every age, you and I are tempted to wish that Jesus would stand by our side, introduce Himself as our server, and ask us what He can bring us. If He were to do that, what would we ask Jesus to bring us? Job security? A retirement plan that won't run out of money? A vehicle that starts each morning? Better grades?

We thank God that His Servant, Jesus, does *not* pop into our lives every so often to tell us He'll give us what *we* desire. Why? Because we'd most often ask for that which doesn't last, isn't good for us, and gets in the way of our life lived for Him.

We thank God that His Servant and our Savior, Jesus, came to our world to give us what we need! Jesus didn't arrive on earth to demand, "You lowly, sinful human beings are My servants! Bring Me a hot meal, cold water, and comfortable clothes!" Jesus came to earth as God's Servant and our Savior to serve us lowly, sinful humans by giving us what we need: His life as the only ransom price His Father accepts for each sinner. Jesus came to earth to deliver what we can't live without spiritually or eternally: His holiness and His sacrifice in our place.

I know. You've heard all that before. A part of us longs for the pastor, the church, the school to come up with something new and improved to say, to preach, to teach, to hear, to write, to trust. Our selfish sinful nature grumbles when it doesn't get what feeds its earth-centered thinking and existence.

But the message of Jesus serving us sinners with thirty-three years of perfect obedience to His own laws and with His suffering hell at the cross fully for every sin is what we need every day. Are you getting it every day? If you aren't, watch for the arrival of the next issue of *Meditations*—and when you pick up your copy from church, use its devotions daily at home. If you aren't, clear your schedule for the first morning of every week—and hear the spiritually-renewing message with fellow believers in God's house. If you aren't, keep the things that don't last further down your life's priorities and put the good news about Jesus at the very top of your personal and family priorities. Already now, in these last days of January or first days of February, schedule time to receive more of that spiritual food in the midweek Lent services that begin March 1.

Given the depressing news in newspapers and on broadcasts, maybe we've wished God would work some miracles in our world the way He did in Biblical times. He does! He comes to us daily to serve us with His Gospel! What a miracle! And His Gospel builds up faith in us sinners who, by nature, want to run away from the Savior! What a miracle!

We know what we need and where to get it. We are best served when Jesus gives us life in His Gospel.

# **CHURCH COUNCIL REPORTS**

**PASTOR'S REPORT** – The mother of two students in our preschool and I intend to begin meeting at school one morning each week as she finds out more about the teachings of God's Word and the confessions of our congregation and synod. Another mother of school students may be interested in joining us for these Adult

Instruction Class sessions.

WELS congregations continue to submit the figure for their 2017 WELS Congregation Mission Offering (CMO) commitment, with a deadline of February 3 this year. The WELS Synodical Council (SC) will meet later in February. The SC, based on what WELS congregations have submitted for 2017 CMO commitments, will decide at that meeting if adjustments need to be made for the balance of this fiscal year's budget, and will use those commitments as they recommend to the summer 2017 WELS Convention delegates a budget for the next two fiscal years.

I have submitted our 2017 CMO subscription of \$0 to WELS. Added to that submission was the explanation to the representative who gathers those figures for Michigan District congregations that there will likely be special offerings to WELS by members of our congregation during 2017.

I'll evaluate with the Board of Elders, after we've done so for a little more than one month, the service synopsis now being given by the pastor after the pre-service music and before the singing of the first hymn.

What I hope the synopsis does *not* lead to is the idea that only when the pastor begins those comments is it time to prepare for worship. We continue to strive for maintaining a pre-service atmosphere in the church sanctuary that is conducive for personal meditation and worship preparations.

**BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION** – Preschool enrollment is at 10. This is up two from the prior month; one re-enrollment and one new enrollment. Kindergarten is at 2 and grades 1-5 have 11 students.

We discussed possible tuition increase for the upcoming school year. We will communicate to the current parents at a meeting February 15<sup>th</sup>.

The Board of Christian Education has organized as follows for 2017: Howard Clark-chairman, Dave Fortin-secretary, and Norm Schlicker-chairman of the PTO.

We discussed targeted Facebook marketing for young families. Laurie Voss will research this.

Preliminary work was done on the calendar for the 2017-2018 school year.

We discussed at what point we would close school due to multiple students' absences because of illness.

The board thanks Laurie Voss for doing student picture retakes.

The board thanks our Sunday School teachers for providing lunch to the children and their family members after the first Saturday Christmas Eve service rehearsal.

The board thanks the members who provided children with a gift on Christmas Eve.

We discussed the dates for VBS for this summer. We are looking at the feasibility of Monday, June 26 through Thursday, June 29 – one month earlier than normal, and a 4-day VBS if it is held close to the 4<sup>th</sup> of July.

**BOARD OF ELDERS** – The Board of Elders recommends the transfer of membership of Samantha Loeffler to Good Shepherd Ev. Lutheran Church in Midland, Michigan.

We organized for 2017 as follows: Rex Hannewald-chairman, Bob Briggs-secretary and head usher is a vacant position.

The monies received during our annual December door offering have been sent to Michigan Lutheran Seminary.

**BOARD OF EVANGELISM AND STEWARDSHIP** – We organized the board as follows for 2017: Joe Janecke-chairman and Jason Leitz-secretary.

Our office secretary has worked with our website provider to set it up to view our web site's analytics, allowing us to see how many hits the various web site links receive.

A community dinner will be happening sometime this winter.

We thank everyone who hosted and helped with the Advent suppers.

The WELS Connection has been renewed for 2017.

#### **BOARD OF TRUSTEES** – Our board thanks Bruce Painter for his service on our board.

Many items have been looked at for service: parsonage garage door, heating in the upper grade classroom, doors at the school, along with general maintenance.

David Dawley updated our board with water testing, informed us of a 6 year test that was just completed, cost was more than anticipated for the budget, almost \$500.00.
