


MEMORIAL MESSENGER February 2019



He who does what is sinful is of the devil, because the devil has been sinning from the beginning. The reason the Son of God appeared was to destroy the devil's work. 1 John 3:8

When Jesus lived on earth, Satan used everything he could to derail Christ's mission. Satan sent his wicked helpers from hell to invade the bodies of people in Israel during our Lord's ministry. The demons Jesus drove out are fallen angels in league with Satan, himself a fallen angel. The devil hoped he and his helpers could get Jesus to slip up and sin just once, or get Jesus to abandon His march to His cross to win our salvation.

Satan's work doesn't seem nearly so visible in our culture and in our day as it was in our Savior's day. Maybe that's Satan's plan. His easiest victories are won with those who don't take him seriously. Those who think he's only a cartoon figure wearing red, showing horns, and holding a pitchfork don't suppose the devil is a real foe to fight. If Satan used more visible ways, he'd be easier to spot and to resist. Instead, he works in ways that are more subtle, but just as damning!

Whether working on us out in the open and in ways we can almost feel, or working on us behind the scenes with temptations that don't seem so bad, the devil remains very real. His most effective strategy with us is to get us to ignore him, see his temptations as just alternate ways to live. Ignoring the devil's reality and power is like ignoring carbon monoxide. You may not *feel* the devil's influence, but you're going to get hurt spiritually.

Satan wants to get us, who trust today in Christ's forgiveness, to move over to his dark side. He wants to devour our faith and steal our soul. He tries to take away our trust in Christ by nibbling at that trust little bites at a time. He does that by tempting us to hear God's Word less often, to pay less attention to God's kingdom, to consult God less frequently to guide us in life, to suppose it's *our* life to live as *we* please.

The Christchild came to earth to defeat the devil, "to destroy the devil's work". Jesus won the victory, and we enjoy the results of His victory accomplished in His holy life for us and His innocent death in our place.

That doesn't mean Satan won't tempt us any longer. In fact, he spends a lot of time trying to move believers off their Rock and their Salvation – Jesus. When the devil knocks at the door of our heart, we tell him, "Go away! *He who does what is sinful is of the devil!*" We will say that often each day since Satan doesn't give up.



Thanks be to God that the victory is ours in our Savior! When Christ's victory is held tightly in our heart, Satan cannot win. See you in God's house each Sunday to get another dose of Christ's saving victory!

IF YOU WILL BE AWAY FROM CHURCH and/or out of town for an extended period of time, there is a convenient way to submit regularly your thankoffering. You can instruct your bank to mail a check to *Memorial Ev. Lutheran Church / 1022 W. Grand River Ave. / Williamston, MI 48895*. When such checks arrive the mail, they are given to our thankoffering counters the following Monday. The amount is deposited into our General Fund, and the amount is noted for your account as our Financial Secretary keeps a record of all thankofferings by our members.

WHEN FILLING OUT your thankoffering envelope, please be aware of the following:

- You *don't* need to write your name on the line provided. The identifying number in the upper corner is all that our financial secretary needs.
- We ask that you *do* list the amount placed inside the envelope on the line provided for that purpose. This information is needed by our financial secretary. If you do not list it, the counters will write it in when opening the envelope.

Some members are uneasy about others seeing the amount written on the envelope as the offering plate moves across the pews. We suggest putting the envelope in the plate face down. That will allow you to provide the information needed by our counters, financial secretary, and treasurer, yet keep your offering amount confidential.

<u>FORWARD IN CHRIST</u> If you wish to renew your subscription to *Forward in Christ*, our Synod's magazine, or order a new subscription, you may use the envelope in your 2019 envelope packet that is marked for this purpose.

Subscription price will be \$11.50 for this year, provided that enough families subscribe and we can take advantage of that bulk subscription rate. That price covers twelve monthly issues. If you subscribe through the congregation, your issue will be mailed to the church and placed in your box in the narthex.

Forward In Christ is an excellent periodical! It contains Bible studies, articles about how our Savior's love for us has affected people's lives, news from our Synod and religious information from around the world, and a number of other features. If you would like to see a few issues to get an idea of what the magazine is like, speak to Pastor Voss.

CHURCH COUNCIL REPORTS

PASTOR'S REPORT – One of the Bible Instruction Classes that began in the fall is on hold because the prospect who was studying God's Word with me have moved out of state. The other class that began in the fall continues.

The WELS Synodical council (SC) has a meeting in late February each year. The SC will use this year's February meeting to finalize work on the WELS two-year budget to be proposed to the delegates at this summer's WELS Convention. The SC will take a close look at CMO subscriptions for 2019 to determine how much of a budget increase – if any – to recommend.

The officers of the Michigan District will be meeting in the Toledo area Monday, January 28-Wednesday, January 30 (and maybe into Thursday, January 31). I will be away from that Monday morning and will return as soon as meetings are over.
