Jesus asked, "Didn't you know that I had to be in / about My Father's...? Luke 2:49

Stud God's Word

Most Bible students are familiar with Luke 2:49. Some English Bible translations render the passage "in My Father's <u>house</u>", and others "about My Father's <u>business</u>". The Greek words that the Holy Spirit gave Luke here relate something like "in My Father's" – without specifying whether Jesus was referring to His Father's house or His Father's business.

The translation "business" seems preferable. The 12-year-old Jesus was telling Joseph and Mary that His main concern was what the heavenly Father had sent Him to earth to do. That, of course, would be His Father's business. That would also be the main topic of discussion in the temple at Jerusalem, His Father's house.

But rather than getting bogged down discussing the wording of the verse, let's apply the verse's truth to our lives as God's people. At an age when most boys are figuring out their chances to make the travel soccer team or bugging their parents to get a new iPhone, our Savior was busy pursuing our salvation. Not yet a teenager at the time of this conversation with Joseph and Mary, Jesus was most interested in – and perfectly focused on – saving us from the guilt of sin which we pile up daily. What a Savior He is! What a Savior we have!

The sinless Son of God was at the house of God. He was hearing and studying and discussing God's Word. Think about that! The Word points to Him who is "the Word" (John 1:1, 14), to Jesus, to Him who is One "who takes away the sin of the world" (John 1:29). Jesus hearing and studying and discussing the Word which He knew perfectly was Jesus obeying God's law for us. We often think about Jesus suffering on the cross to remove our curse. But just as important in His work to save us was His perfect keeping of the law in our place.

Why do we forget about that at times? The pastor gets some blame because he doesn't mention it often enough from the pulpit or in front of the class. But we also forget it because we don't dig often enough into the Word to ponder the sublime truth that "we have One who has been tempted in every way, just as we are – yet was without sin" (Hebrews 4:15). Add to that the fact that Satan wants us to suppose Jesus was just twiddling His thumbs for 33 years until it came time to get His work done on Good Friday.

As we rejoice that the Savior has come to earth and has perfectly completed His mission for us, may our rejoicing be more than just words of praise to Him in home devotions and weekly worship services. May our rejoicing also be a renewed commitment to study His truth, to share His message, to grow in trusting what He's done to rescue us from certain destruction in hell. May our lives reflect our gratitude to Him who made the full payment required by His Father to buy back our souls. We're most

richly blessed when we fill our hearts with all that Jesus has done to accomplish His Father's business, His saving mission, our complete redemption!

<u>OUR 10-FOR-10</u> Stewardship emphasis continues. We are not hoping to get more money into the General Fund. We are rather encouraging you to ponder earnestly how richly God has blessed us sinners with forgiveness and eternal life in Christ, and then to consider prayerfully whether it is feasible for us to increase our thankofferings.

The first <u>10</u> in 10-For-10 is a suggestion that members evaluate committing 10% of their income to support the Lord's kingdom work (the percentage that God

required of His Old Testament people in Israel). If that isn't feasible for you, we ask you to consider increasing your thankofferings by 10% of the amount you had been offering in 2019.

The second <u>10</u> in 10-For-10 is **10** weeks. We suggest individuals and families consider an increase in thankofferings for the 10-week period from January 19 – March 29. At the end of those 10 weeks, individual and families will re-evaluate the amount of thankofferings they bring to the Lord.

Please understand that these are only suggestions. We also stress that there will not be any reports generated about specific giving units with an increase or decrease in thankofferings.

May our gracious God fill our hearts with joy in Jesus, and move us to offer him a percentage of our Godgiven gifts that honors Him!

IF YOU WILL BE AWAY FROM CHURCH and/or out of town for an extended period of time, there is a convenient way to submit regularly your thankoffering. You can instruct your bank to mail a check to *Memorial Ev. Lutheran Church / 1022 W. Grand River Ave. / Williamston, MI 48895*. When such checks arrive the mail, they are given to our thankoffering counters the following Monday. The amount is deposited into our General Fund, and the amount is noted for your account as our Financial Secretary keeps a record of all thankofferings by our members.

WHEN FILLING OUT your thankoffering envelope, please be aware of the following:

- You *don't* need to write your name on the line provided. The identifying number in the upper corner is all that our financial secretary needs.
- We ask that you *do* list the amount placed inside the envelope on the line provided for that purpose. This information is needed by our financial secretary. If you do not list it, the counters will write it in when opening the envelope.

Some members are uneasy about others seeing the amount written on the envelope as the offering plate moves across the pews. We suggest putting the envelope in the plate face down. That will allow you to provide the information needed by our counters, financial secretary, and treasurer, yet keep your offering amount confidential.

IF YOU HAVE ACCESS to the internet and get this *Memorial Messenger* that way, please let us know and we will no longer print a copy for you.

<u>FORWARD IN CHRIST</u> - If you wish to renew your subscription to *Forward in Christ*, our Synod's magazine, or order a new subscription, you may use the envelope in your 2019 envelope packet that is marked for this purpose.

Subscription price will be \$11.50 for this year, provided that enough families subscribe and we can take advantage of that bulk subscription rate. That price covers twelve monthly issues. If you subscribe through the congregation, your issue will be mailed to the church and placed in your box in the narthex.

CHURCH COUNCIL REPORTS

PASTOR'S REPORT – I thank the Board of Elders for consulting with me late into the evening on Saturday, January 11 and very early the next morning as together we made the decision to cancel the 8:00 service, along with Sunday School and Bible class that day.

Our congregation thanks David Fortin for serving as narrator during the Christmas Eve worship service. Dave's willingness to attend the Saturday morning rehearsals was also a huge benefit to all who prepared spoken and musical proclamation of the Christmas Gospel about our newborn Savior.

BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION – Enrollment at 29 is unchanged. An application was received for a prospective 3 year old preschool student and was approved by the board.

Facebook posts continue to reach many people.

The board thanks Mrs. Domke and Mrs. Leitz for their work with the students for their songs and speaking parts for the Christmas Eve service.

We will host the CMLAL Volleyball Tournament for our area WELS schools in our gym March 28.

There will be no school February 10 because of Pastor/Teacher conference in Saginaw. There will also be no school February 17 because of Presidents' Day.

PTO will host the Lent super on February 26.
