

MEMORIAL MESSENGER January 2018



"On the eighth day, when it was time to circumcise Him, He was named Jesus." (Luke 2:21)

Before each special day was used as a reason to sell merchandise, New Year's Day held special *spiritual* significance in the Christian Church. The eighth day after December 25—according to the way Jews counted time—is January 1. Since the time of Abraham, boys in his family line were circumcised on the eighth day of life outside the womb. So, the eighth day of the ongoing Christmas season marks the circumcision of Jesus.

Circumcision seems silly to some today. But it was a command from God for the Jews before Christ. And God packed circumcision with meaning. It was God's sign to assure His people of His promises. The cutting off of some flesh was also symbolic of removing inner impurity.

Then why would Jesus, the *sinless* Savior, be circumcised? We've just celebrated the fact that He is the true God who makes promises to people. Why would the Son of God need assurance of promises *He* made? He didn't! In our festival worship services, we reviewed the great truth that Jesus remained true God after taking on human flesh. Why would He need a ceremony picturing removal of inner purity? He didn't!

Jesus was circumcised *for us*. We miss a lot if we see Christ's suffering on the cross as the only work He did to redeem us. He who gives laws to sinners willingly put Himself under His own laws for the sake of sinners. Jesus kept God's law *for us, to redeem us*.

Circumcision was not a major medical procedure; it was over within seconds. But a little blood was shed by Jewish baby boys and some pain was suffered. Do you see the salvation connection? On the eighth day of His life, our newborn Savior first shed His holy, precious blood *for us*, first suffered *for us*.

Joseph and Mary didn't ask Jesus if He wanted to be circumcised; they had the procedure done, and the Son of God allowed human hands to do that to Him. What love the baby Jesus showed that day! What rich evidence of His commitment to pay the price to buy us back to God's family! He who is God-in-the-flesh let His flesh be cut *for us*. At tender age of one *week* old He was working to redeem us—obeying His law in our place and shedding His blood *for us*.

Most Americans think that on New Year's Day they are doing something noble by resolving to change habits. How much better to resolve on New Year's Day that we'll ponder every day what Jesus has done *for us*. That means more Bible study, more consideration of God's truth, more attention to His will, more worship in His house.

May this brief review of an often-forgotten act in our Savior's work of redemption give new meaning to what we ponder on New Year's Day. May our Savior's richest blessings fill you and your family in 2018!

<u>WE REMIND</u> the re-elected and newly elected board members and officers that their terms begin January 1 (their first official meetings will be in early January). The plan, for now, is to have installation for these men during the worship services on *January* 7.

EVANGELICAL HERITAGE VERSION The Board of Elders, in consultation with Pastor Voss, has decided that we will use the Evangelical Heritage Version (EHV) translation for Scripture lessons on a trial basis.

The EHV is a translation of the Bible by pastors and professors in WELS and in ELS, a small church body in full doctrinal fellowship with WELS. The translation work has been done entirely without budget funds from WELS. It is hoped that the printed EHV translation of the entire Bible will be available from Northwestern Publishing House this year or next year.

2018 THANKOFFERING ENVELOPES If you haven't yet picked up your 2018 thankoffering envelopes, please get them from your mail slot. Some of your family's envelopes may be on the counter below the mailboxes.

Your thankoffering statement, reflecting your thankofferings for 2017, will be prepared and placed in your mail slot by the end of January.

WHEN FILLING OUT your thankoffering envelope, please be aware of the following:

- You *don't* need to write your name on the line provided. The identifying number in the upper corner is all that our financial secretary needs.
- We ask that you *do* list the amount placed inside the envelope on the line provided for that purpose. This information is needed by our financial secretary. If you do not list it, the counters will write it in when opening the envelope.

Some members are uneasy about others seeing the amount written on the envelope as the offering plate moves across the pews. We suggest putting the envelope in the plate face down. That will allow you to provide the information needed by our financemen, yet keep your offering amount confidential.



CHURCH COUNCIL REPORTS

PASTOR'S REPORT – We thank our Sunday School staff for once again volunteering to host a meal for the children and their families after the Christmas Eve service rehearsal on Saturday, December 23.

WELS news: WELS Congregation Mission Offerings (CMO) continue to run ahead of last year (through November) and continue to run ahead of pro-rated subscription amounts by WELS congregations for this calendar year.

WELS Congregational Services (CS) personnel attended the November meeting of the WELS Synodical Council (SC). As we heard and saw in the November WELS Connection, WELS CS is studying the demographic challenges facing our synod, and is making plans to help congregations address those challenges. Congregations will be provided with resources as they address ministry to millennials, work to reduce the number of backdoor losses, and emphasize evangelism. They will also provide guidelines to congregations considering mergers as a means to improve their ministries.

More than $1{,}000$ separate screenings of A Return to Grace were hosted by WELS congregations throughout the nation this year.

We continue to research the best way to keep the 655-2294 phone number, but eliminate the cost of the land line. So far, it appears that we'd have to purchase a piece of equipment to provide a wireless home phone system (\$45 - \$99, depending on the company), then pay \$15 - \$20 per month for the service (again, the amount depends on the company).

Do any of you have different ideas or know of another alterative that will be closer to the \$120 we budgeted for 2018 for the church phone?

Installation of re-elected Church Councilmen will take place in the worship services January 7.

BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION – Enrollment is 24. (two new students since our last meeting) Preschool: 5 Kindergarten: 5 Grades 1-5: now 14

School promotion: Facebook -Targeted Facebook marketing Nov. 8-18 for \$200, paid by PTO. Results: 47K local impressions/33 link clicks / 23K people reached

General School items: Standardized tests- \$28 X 8 students in grades 3-5, plus shipping – Order by December 31.

Board reviewed monthly use of debit card and receipts, as well as log being used.

PTO concession money deposits: Seems to be working well with our thankoffering counters

Reviewed the verbiage of a letter Pastor Voss drafted a letter to inform school families this month about how our school is funded, that a modest increase for 2018-2019 tuition rates is being considered by the board, and to let families know how they can submit a special gift to the congregation in appreciation for the Christian education their children and grandchildren receive at our school.

Began discussions of tuition rates for 2018-19 school year

VBS Last week of June worked well in 2017. Discussed keeping it during that week for 2018.

BOARD OF ELDERS – A computer is being prepared for use with the HymnSoft software at church when an organist is not available. We are working to patch the computer into the organ's MIDI unit. The Elders will seek individuals who are able and willing to run the program during worship service as needed. The office secretary, in consultation with Pastor, will be responsible for setting up HymnSoft when needed.

Beginning in the new year will use the Evangelical Heritage Version translation of Scripture for our Scripture lessons in worship.

The annual December door offering was received December 17 & 24. Money collected will be given to WELS Christian Aid & Relief.

The Elders discussed security during worship service. After hearing from members of the congregation, the Elders have decided not to lock the door to the basement at the bottom of the ramp.

The next organist schedule is being prepared. The Elders thank our organists for using their God given talents to edify our worship services.

BOARD OF EVANGELISM AND STEWARDSHIP – We distributed WELS DVDs to visitors at Advent and Christmas services.

Discussed the refreshments on the first Sunday of the month. To get more people than just those who are in Sunday School and Bible Class to attend, we are going to move the time to 9:05-9:25 in January. We hope that early service worshipers will join us in the fellowship hall after the service.

We have renewed the WELS Connection for 2018.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES – Light fixtures were replaced in the narthex.

Larry Shipman will be available for snow removal this winter.

All furnace filters have been replaced.

The gas line supports on the roof of school will need some work spring or summer 2018.

The public water well supply invoice was discussed and paid. Our class code is correct and will not be considered for change.

The cleaning schedule was discussed. We will ask for it to be printed and distributed.
