Many are asking, "Who can show us any good?"

You're familiar with *Christmas in July* sales, and why stores have them. Such sales are meant to encourage shoppers to buy products during a typically slow season of the year.

But every month of the year is Christmas for Christians. The "peace" which God sent His holy angels to proclaim the night the world's Savior was born is the "peace" that fills the believer's heart every day.

A few days from now our nation will mark two hundred forty-two years of independence. The independence we Americans enjoy came at the cost of many brave soldiers who fought in a number of conflicts to secure our freedom, and to win peace for our nation peace.

But all those lives sacrificed don't come close to the sacrifice of Jesus for the sins of the world. The peace we enjoy as a country is nothing compared to the peace we enjoy as God's forgiven children. "I will lie down and sleep in peace, for You alone, O LORD, make me dwell in safety."

The Holy Spirit used King David to write those words. Recall the struggles and battles, the attacks and downfalls that David went through in his life: taking on the Philistine giant Goliath, being hunted by jealous King Saul, sleeping with someone not his wife, dealing with betrayal by his son Absalom, and more. Whether it was trouble others fired at him or evil David brought on himself, God's peace in the Savior to come from his own family line sustained David from his youth as a shepherd boy until his death as an elderly ruler of Israel.

The verses from Psalm 8 printed above are often used by our pastors at the bedside of those about to undergo surgery and of those who are near death. In fact, those verses were used with the sister of ours just before the Savior took her soul to heaven through faith in Him the last day of May. What peace is ours in Jesus – whether



we awake in good health or are facing a serious situation or feel our earthly life slipping away!

Enjoy peace and freedom as an American this glorious summer holiday! But be sure to treasure every day the peace that goes beyond our understanding, the peace of forgiveness won by Jesus, the peace of being God's child, the peace of knowing that heaven is ours through trust in Jesus.



<u>OUR SUMMER WORSHIP SCHEDULE</u> continues. There is one Sunday service at *9:00 AM* beginning that morning. Most weeks there will be a *Thursday evening service at 7:00* which will be the same as the following Sunday's service. This summer schedule will continue through Labor Day weekend.

CHURCH COUNCIL REPORTS

PASTOR'S REPORT – *WELS news* Through the first 5 months of 2018, Congregation Mission Offerings across WELS are about \$240,000 behind the same period last year, and the CMO is right at the prorated subscription amounts from WELS congregations. In our district, about \$16,000 less has been submitted than at this point in 2017 – but what has been submitted is \$20,000 ahead of prorated subscriptions.

The WELS Assignment Committee assigned all available teacher and pastor candidates to fields of service last month. 40 congregations requesting a pastor candidate were not able to have their request filled, since there were 34 candidates and 75 requests.

At last month's Michigan District Convention our congregation was represented by Bob Janecke and Pastor Voss. Delegates heard reports about WELS and Michigan District ministry, and urged all district congregations in increase congregation mission thankofferings. The delegates elected Pastor Snowden Sims of St. Paul Ev. Lutheran Church in Columbus, Ohio as district president. Pastor Voss was elected district 1st vice-president, Pastor Tom Westra of Cincinnati, OH as district 2nd vice-president, and Pastor Jason Baldwin of St. Charles, MI as district secretary.

BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION – Enrollment: Projected for 2018-19 is preschool: 4; kindergarten: 6 or 7 and grades 1-5:18.

All students in K-4 last school year plan to enroll for 2018-19. In addition, 4 preschool students who were 4 years old last school year will enroll as kindergarten students – along with 2 kindergarten students who were not in our preschool.

School Promotion: Next targeted Facebook marketing will be July 14-20 to promote school & VBS, and then again August 12-18 to promote school enrollment.

Grades 1-5: It's been a great school year. We congratulate Satressa Dawley who graduated from 5th Grade. Preschool and Kindergarten: We will be happy to have the same aides for preschool next year who have served so well the past two years. Our preschool passed an unannounced inspection in late May.

Thank you to all families for their help before, during, and after our school plays! In less than 30 minutes the stage, backdrop, lights, speakers, microphones, chairs, and tables were put away. We especially thank Bryan Grinnell for his work every year to set up lights and provide the sound system for the plays.

VBS calls have been extended and accepted. Our VBS July 23-26 will use ChristLight materials. A dedicated crew of women is preparing VBS projects for students. A potluck supper will be held at school July 26, and the Thursday evening worship service will be held at school that evening.

The board extended Sunday School calls for 2018-19 to those who taught this past year.

BOARD OF ELDERS – The Elders reviewed the Ascension service, and how to increase attendance at this church festival service.

Due to Pastor being on vacation there will not be a Thursday evening worship service on July 19. Unless a guest preacher can be found an elder will conduct worship service on Sunday, July 22 in Pastor's absence. If that is the case, there will not be Holy Communion that morning.

The Thursday evening worship service for July 26 will be held at school in conjunction with the closing of VBS, and after a potluck supper at school that evening.

BOARD OF EVANGELISM AND STEWARDSHIP – Saturday, August 11 was chosen for the Lugnuts game. Promotion continues.

We discussed the Red Cedar Jubilee parade on June 23. Flyers were distributed about our VBS, school and preschool.

We decided that all Thursday, June 28 thankofferings will be considered as Sunday, July 1 thankofferings, and recorded as Third Quarter thankofferings.

Discussed summer refreshment hours. We need lots of host families.

We discussed the date and plans for the September 9 church picnic.

The Ladies Fellowship Group is planning a pancake meal at school on September 30 for all our worshipers that morning.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES – We updated and distributed updated cleaning schedule through December of 2018

We reviewed the Congregations insurance renewal for June 15th, 2018 through 2019.

Toilets at the school had a major blockage that was taken care of.

Steve Houser will be doing some of the painting project, as time permits.

The old light pole on the east side of school will be removed.

On June 23rd we power washed the church.

The gym floor was refinished in early June. It looks really nice.
