Dear Christian graduate,




<u>WE WELCOME</u> to our congregation, two young families received by transfer of membership last month:

CHURCH COUNCIL REPORTS

PASTOR'S REPORT – We've received information for the 2016 Michigan District Convention. The Board of Elders and Church Council appointed Joe Zoran to be our lay delegate.

The convention begins at 1:00 Monday, June 6 and runs until Wednesday afternoon, June 8. Because I'll be in Saginaw on Tuesday evening of that week, two of our boards are moving their monthly meeting to Wednesday, June 8.

WELS news: As of April 30, gifts from God's people have reached nearly \$2 million for the *One in Christ* WELS debt elimination offering. The Synodical Council (SC) has determined that if the debt is not completely retired by the middle of June, regular payments will continue to be made from the synod's budget, with the entire debt expected to be eliminated by the 2017 WELS Convention.

The SC also approved the support forecast. Based on the best available information, the forecast indicates that the areas of ministry will need to plan for no increase in financial support from the synod's operating budget. Support from Congregation Mission Offerings (CMO) is conservatively projected to increase by 0.5 percent in each year of the biennium, with support from other sources projected to be flat. With the assumption of no increase in support from the synod's operating budget, areas of ministry will either need to identify other funding sources or reduce spending. If actual CMO receipts exceed projections or if other support is greater than projected, the SC has the ability to make adjustments to synod support throughout the financial plan development process.

We have invited WELS musician Stephen Bautista to present his music here at church on Monday evening June 20, and he is delighted to except that invitation. His music will be part of our summer Monday evening worship service on that date. As this report is being prepared, there are still some details to work out.

BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION – The board put ads in the *Williamston Enterprise* and *Town Courier* newspapers last month about enrolling in our school. We will also check with a few members about contact information for ads in the Fowlerville newspaper.

Digital pictures from field trips and special school events are being added to our web site as the pictures are submitted.

Beginning next school year Mrs. Leitz desires that the last preschool session be the Wednesday of the last week of school, allowing her to be with just the kindergarten students on the last day of school which is Friday. The board supports this change for next school year.

Teacher assessment forms were discussed with our teachers and signed by the board. We thank the Lord for our faithful teachers and the gifts He has given them.

At last month's PTO meeting we discussed with the parents the possibility of going from 3 to 2 meetings per year and having meals in connection with both meetings. It's our opinion that doing so will increase attendance at the April meeting (usually poorly attended, as has been the January meeting). If this plan is adopted, we will drop the January meeting each year.

VBS will be held July 25-29 this summer from 9:00-11:30 year day.

The board understands the current concern about lead in water supplies. Our school has no lead pipes, even in the oldest part of our building. Water tests are taken at regular intervals because our school building's water comes from a well and regular tests are required by the state's Department of Environmental Quality.

BOARD OF ELDERS – The Board of Elders recommends that Kevin and Hana Fedewa (and son Noah) be received into membership at Memorial Ev. Lutheran Church by transfer from St. John Ev. Lutheran Church of Wauwatosa, WI.

The Board of Elders recommends that John and Jacquelen Timm be received into membership at Memorial Ev. Lutheran Church by transfer from St. Paul Ev. Lutheran Church of Saginaw, MI.

Aaron Voss will preach as guest preacher here on June 19, 2016. He should be paid as guest preacher, but not receive mileage reimbursement.

The Elders discussed our worship schedule and the possibility of having only one worship service Sunday mornings. The Elders have prepared a survey for the congregation to help determine what the wishes of the congregation are regarding our worship schedule.

BOARD OF EVANGELISM AND STEWARDSHIP – We discussed options of recording sermons and adding them to our website. We are looking into testing this using borrowed equipment.

Community Outreach – A meeting was set for May 22 for beginning to plan this.

August 6th was selected for the Lugnut game, and a signup sheet is posted at church.

We discussed our participation in the Red Cedar Jubilee Parade on June 25. Unless we have volunteers to design and build a float, our entry will be children, young people, and adults walking along the parade route with our church and school banner. They will distribute flyers about our school, preschool, and VBS.

We thank Dan Kasischke for getting the first quarter statements out.

We thank Joe Zoran and David Fortin for conducting the audit of our financial records.

We thank Kim Fedewa for his excellent and faithful work as church treasurer.

We started to look into getting more information for a new church sign.

Sunday, September 11 was chosen as the date for our annual church picnic.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES – If the upright piano in the upper grade room is not wanted our board may remove it.

The steeple will be removed this summer. Our board is discussing the best options for removal.

We will contact Myer heating to re-seal the hating units at school.

We discussed the driveway cracks and resealing parking lots.

The mowing list will be up on Signup Genius.

We will also trim some trees to make mowing a little easier.
