There will be a special voters meeting **Wednesday, May 29 at 7:00 PM** to act on leasing space in our school for a child care center.


who attend.

CHURCH COUNCIL REPORTS

PASTOR'S REPORT – Our district's president, vice-presidents, and secretary are still working on final details for the 2019 special Michigan District Convention at Bowling Green State University in Bowling Green, Ohio from Monday afternoon, June 10 until Wednesday noon, June 12. Because it is being held away from MLS in Saginaw, convention lodging and meals will be more expensive.

WELS news CMO receipts through the end of April across WELS are \$6,077,653 (\$6,128,082 at the same time in 2018), and the CMO for that period of time is nearly \$200,000 ahead of pro-rated subscriptions by WELS congregations for 2019. Michigan District congregations have submitted \$717,482 (compared to \$631,472 through April last year), which is nearly \$140,000 above pro-rated subscriptions by Michigan District congregations

We continue seeking more volunteers to operate HymnSoft for our worship services. No computer skills or music skills are needed. All it takes is a knowledge of when to press the laptop space bar so that the next music selection is played. Everything is set up before worshipers arrive, and the service's HymnSoft selections are ready several days before the service. Please consider volunteering and/or encouraging members to volunteer. The July – December organ and HymnSoft schedule is being worked on right now, but won't become final for a while. There is still time for new volunteers to come forward.

Plans continue for the Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary satellite course at MLS in Saginaw the last week of June. Right now, it looks like that course will run until Friday morning of that week. In early June I'll discuss with the Board of Elders the need to cancel the Thursday evening service on June 27.

BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION – Projected enrollment 2019-2020, based on what we know as of May 7:

- Fourth grade 3
- Fifth grade 2

We thank our office secretary for posting news and invitations on Facebook. The "Now Enrolling" post was see by over 1,400 people and was shared by 10 people.

We discussed getting more school yard signs made and the logistics for doing so.

A preschool inspector came unannounced. Our license renewal was granted. We thank Mrs. Leitz for all her work making contacts and getting paperwork submitted.

Mrs. Domke did a great job of organizing concessions for the CMLAL volleyball tournament. Thank you.

We asked parents to help take down the stage after the night plays are performed. Our thanks to the Domke family for their work putting up the stage initially and taking it down before volleyball.

The school closing service is Ascension Festival service too, Thursday May 30.

Calls were extended by the board to four members to teach at our July 22-25 VBS.

BOARD OF ELDERS – The Board of Elders welcomes Steve Houser to the Board. The Board organized as follows: Chairman - Steve Houser Secretary - Bob Briggs Head Usher - vacant

Pastor Voss will be on vacation Sunday, July 21. A retired pastor has agreed to conduct worship service here that Sunday.

The Elders reviewed Lenten services and special services for Holy Week.

Our Summer worship schedule begins with one service on Sunday May 26 at 9 AM. Thursday evening worships service will begin May 23 at 7 PM. Due to Pastor's vacation plans there will not be a Thursday evening service on July 17.

Chime Choir rehearsal has resumed. The Voice Choir will resume later this fall. The Elders thank the directors and all the members of both choirs for using their God given talents to edify our worship services.

Organist and HymnSoft operator schedules for July through December are being prepared. The Elders thank our organists and HymnSoft operators for using their God given talents to edify our worship services.

BOARD OF EVANGELISM AND STEWARDSHIP – We discussed the website and updates to it, along with last month's web site analytics.

We thank the members who helped host the first Sunday of the month refreshments the last three months. We also thank all those who hosted Lenten suppers.

The after-service presentation this quarter will be done by the Board of Trustees, most likely on June 2.

We promoted the annual Required Minimum Distributions (RMD) for members who reach the age of 70 by putting letter from WELS Ministry of Christian Giving about RMD in mail slots.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES – We discussed the parsonage garage door. After multiple fixes, it may be time to replace the garage door.

It was reported that there were loose shingles on the church sign. They were repaired.
