Blessed is the man who does not walk in the counsel of the wicked or stand in the way of sinners or sit in the seat of mockers. But his delight is in

the law of the LORD, and on His law he meditates day and night. He is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither. Whatever he does prospers. Psalm 1:1-3

For a while this spring, we wondered whether the weather would ever warm enough to produce leaves and blossoms on the trees. It snowed the third week of April! But the LORD who has promised that seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night will never cease has sent warmer temperatures, has dressed our trees and shrubs with blossoms and leaves. All around us, plant life is sprouting and growing.

As we marvel at that, the LORD who produces such growth wants us to take a look at ourselves. Is spiritual life sprouting and growing within us? Spiritually are we like a tree planted by streams of water that is yielding its fruit and whose leaves remain green? Or is our spiritual condition more like that of a tree stuck in clay, miles from the nearest source of water?

We know what the answer should be. But what is the realistic and honest appraisal of our spiritual condition? Realistically, honestly, we all must admit that this side of heaven we are never where we should be in our devotion to God, our trust in His salvation, and our knowledge of His will. We must confess and pray with the father of the boy who was tortured by an evil spirit, "I do believe; help me overcome my unbelief" (Mark 9:24).

What's the remedy? In the first half of Psalm 1 – reprinted above – God encourages us to make His Word our delight and meditate on it day and night. Clearly, that involves an enthusiastic attitude about home devotions and Bible study. Obviously, that means more than one hour of contact with Scripture per week. Sadly, that isn't done among very many of us, is it?

And annually, the problem is worse during the summer months because so many are so often out of town. Make this year different! This summer, schedule family devotions – even when on vacation. This summer, ask the pastor for the location of the WELS church nearest your vacation destination; then worship there!

Satan wants us to think, "We're going on vacation! We're leaving home to get away from the routine of life! We're not leaving God for good!" Good! But heed God's words above. We don't expect God ever to go on vacation from His work of protecting our lives and forgiving our sins, do we? How does He feel when we decide to go on vacation from worshiping Him and hearing His Word?

These lines aren't meant to shame anyone into worshiping while on vacation and more regularly during the summer. They are reminders that the soul needs daily the *spiritual* rest found only in the work of Jesus. God doesn't expect us children of His to look sick or wilted during the summer. We won't look that way – or *be* that way! – when we keep nourishing our souls with His Word of life and salvation—even during the summer.

CHURCH COUNCIL REPORTS

PASTOR'S REPORT – **WELS news** - Through April, WELS congregations have sent \$6.1 million in CMO, almost \$100,000 more than in the first four months of 2017 and ahead of pro-rated subscriptions for 2018. Michigan District congregations sent \$631,472, about \$21,000 more than last year, of the \$6.1 million.

The WELS Assignment Committee met last month to assign teacher candidates and pastor candidates. We

keep their vital work in our prayers!

Both Michigan District President, Pastor John Seifert, and 1st Vice-President, Pastor Paul Nauman have announced that they are retiring from the full time pastoral ministry this year, so they will not be eligible for reelection to those offices at next month's Michigan District Convention. Our district has been richly blessed by their faithful service and leadership for 24 years

Our former called worker, Principal John Melso, sent me an email message last week asking if our congregation can help with an electrical project by Christ the Lord Lutheran School in Brookfield, WI, the school Principal Melso now serves. A son of Christ the Lord Ev. Lutheran Church & School, Pastor Ryan Kolander, is pastor of the WELS Hispanic mission in Detroit, Palabra de Vida Ev. Lutheran Church; that's the connection between the school in Wisconsin and the upcoming work in Detroit.

Mission thankofferings by students at Christ the Lord have covered the cost of new LED lightbulbs. But it's too expensive to hire a contractor to do the work. Some parents of Christ the Lord Lutheran School students and other congregation members plan to travel to Detroit to install the lightbulbs in the church sanctuary and replace light fixtures in the building's basement. The work is targeted for Friday and Saturday, June 8-9, with a retired electrician from Christ the Lord congregation leading the project.
