

MEMORIAL MESSENGER March 2015



Where sin increased, grace increased all the more, so that, just as sin reigned in death, so also grace might reign through righteousness to bring eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord. What shall we say then? Shall we go on sinning so that grace may increase? By no means! We died to sin; how can we live in it any longer?

Romans 5:20 – 6:2

Some say that it's no coincidence that *Lent* rhymes with *repent*. Although the very first of Luther's 95 theses declares that the entire life of a Christian is one of repentance, Lent is the season of the Christian church year when there's a heightened focus on self-examination and on awareness of our need for salvation won by someone else.

Lent is a time to recognize the many temptations that we face daily to indulge our selfish, sinful desires. The sinful world tells us that no one can tell us what to do. "As long as it feels good and no one gets hurt, it's fine!" We are quick to label substance abuse, embezzlement, harming children as destructive acts.

But how about the less obvious forms of destructive living, those that creep into our lives in clever disguise? The sinful nature inside of me is delighted to compare myself to the flaws of others, and conclude that I'm so much better than they are. That's destructive to my soul because it doesn't examine what's wrong with me. I want to pile up more and more possessions, not satisfied with what God has given me. That's destructive to my walk with God because it suggests that things are more important to me than what the Savior has done for me.

Lent is a time to hear with somber, sensitive consciences the questions that the Holy Spirit had Paul ask. "What shall we say then? Shall we go on sinning so that grace may increase? By no means! We died to sin; how can we live in it any longer?" The extra Lent services and the dominant Lent tone lead us to examine our lives in the light of God's law. Look at the suffering Savior—and see the steep price that God demands be paid for sin! Look at my life with God—and see how easily I walk the other way, the easier way, the way the world walks. Is that why Jesus died for us, and thus we died to sin? Never! Seeing what the Savior has done to rescue me from hell forever, how can [I] love in [sin] any longer?

We're ten days into Lent, and we know where the lessons will take us: to the upper room, the Garden of Gethsemane, the courts of Caiaphas and Annas and Pilate, the cross at Calvary. We don't just shuffle along the way at a safe distance behind Jesus as though we're interested tourists visiting a holy site. He is carrying our

guilt, winning our victory over sin. We walk with Him repentant—sorrowing over sin and rejoicing in His forgiveness and using His power to put sin behind us and living in the freedom He has won for us.

May the Holy Spirit bless our Lent repentance as we walk with Jesus and away from sin!

CHURCH COUNCIL REPORTS

PASTOR'S REPORT – Our district president reports that pastoral vacancies across our Synod are about 52, and there could be a number of additional retirements announced in the next month or two as men nearing 67 years of age set the date when their pastoral service will end. There are 30 seniors graduating from Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary in May, meaning that a number of congregations will likely be experiencing lengthy pastoral vacancies.

In early February Anthem Inc., the claims administrator for WELS-VEBA health insurance, announced that their computer system was hacked. WELS-VEBA is monitoring this situation closely. Anthem is offering free credit monitoring services for WELS-VEBA members.

There will be a special Michigan District Convention June 8-10 to prepare Michigan District delegates on issues to be decided at the WELS Convention July 27-30. The special Michigan District Convention will be held at Adrian College because the staff at Michigan Lutheran Seminary will be preparing to host nearly 500 delegates and guests at the WELS Convention. Since this year's Michigan District Convention will be held away from MLS, the cost for lodging and meals will be somewhat height than in previous years.

BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION – The Board of Christian Education recommends that tuition rates for the 2015-2016 school year remain unchanged from 2014-2015 levels: \$1000.00 for K-5 and \$1350.00 for preschool 3 mornings per week. (There is a \$50 application fee for preschool.)

We organized our board for 2015 as follows: Howard Clark-chairman; Norman Schlicker-chairman of PTO; Dave Fortin-secretary of BOCE.

Mornings with Mommy was held January 18 with 3 in attendance. The next meeting was scheduled for February 19.

Kindergarten Roundup will be held Friday, March 13 from 9:30-11:30. Preschool Roundup will be held Thursday, March 12 from 10:30-11:30.

For the 2015-2016 school year the cut-off age for kindergarten is September 1 (currently October 1). We will adopt the September 1 date that will be used by the Michigan Department of Education, with the ability to make exceptions on a case-by-case basis up to children turning 5 by December 1. (Preschool cut off dates will be the same. Children must turn 3 by September 1 to enter preschool.)

We approved the school calendar for 2015-2106.

We discussed clean up of the computer lab and school in general for obsolete items.

The MLS Fine Arts Fair is March 7 in Saginaw.

The students went to a play in East Lansing on February 12 and PTO covered the cost of the field trip.

The CMLAL Choir Concert is Friday, March 13.

The PTO hosted the first mid-week Lent supper on February 18.

The next PTO meeting is April 15 at 6:30 PM.

BOARD OF ELDERS – The Board of Elders recommends that the congregation pay an additional \$6/month to cover a portion of the increase in monthly charges for internet at the pastor's study.

We are grateful that her health allows Linda Janecke to resume chime choir and voice choir rehearsals.

Our musicians have noted that the piano in the sanctuary doesn't always hold its pitch after the piano is tuned. We thank Bryan Grinnell for his continuing work to tune the piano.

Denis Hart presented the board with a sample of the candle used in a number of congregations when singing "Silent Night" in the Christmas Eve service. We'll continue to discuss how we might use such candles in future Christmas Eve services here, and what it would cost to get the supplies.

We used a *Farewell to Alleluia* statement and hymn to close the worship services on Transfiguration Sunday, February 15.

We discussed last spring's Christian Passover meal and feel that this event is not one to do annually, but every two or three years.

BOARD OF EVANGELISM AND STEWARDSHIP – Internet reliability at school remains an issue, Kim Fedewa or Jason Leitz will take a look at equipment and check the computers used by Laurie Voss and Judy Domke.

We will promote a showing of the *Road to Emmaus* during Lent/Holy Week.

We are planning a bowling outing at City Limits in Mason on April 4th. We will reserve lanes ahead of time.

We discussed Lent suppers. We are looking for volunteers to cover the March 11th supper. The rest of the suppers are covered by different groups.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES – Our board recommends hiring B&D Electric to remove and install new LED lighting in the gymnasium, based on their proposal cost of \$15,530.00.

Our board spent a lot of time researching the cost, efficiency, material pricing, lumens needed, various options on different forms of LED lights, number of lights being used currently vs. reducing the number of lights needed with LED, using our won labor force vs. hiring it out. After reviewing all of these options our board decided the best option is to go with the bid offered by B&D Electric. The material cost from B&D, in our opinion, has not been marked up. The labor cost is based on two men for two days which is very reasonable, and the cost of renting a lift. DTE will provide an estimated rebate of \$1,770.00 (off our billing), \$2,430.00 a year in energy saving, will provide a 5 to 6 year break even on the cost of upgrading the lighting in the gym.

The church furnace went out on a Saturday afternoon and was repaired by GLS Heating for a cost of \$190.00 labor and \$318.00 material.
