

MEMORIAL MESSENGER March 2019



I urge you, brothers, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God – *this is your spiritual act of worship.* Romans 12:1

When we hear *"sacrifice"*, we think of death. Old Testament Israelites were surrounded by sacrifices whenever they entered the outdoor area surrounding their temple in Jerusalem. It was more than the meat roasting on altars. Dead animals' blood, hides, and entrails were spilled and piled up for disposal by the priests' assistants.

How striking, then, for Roman believers to pick up Paul's letter to them and read, "*Offer your bodies as living sacrifices*"! Who had ever heard of such a thing? Isn't it strange to us even in 2019? "*Living sacrifices*"?!

We will soon enter Lent. Christians use this special season to ponder the greatest act of God's mercy. We walk the road to the suffering and death of Him who never did or said or thought anything sinful. Jesus didn't deserve death, much less any suffering. But Jesus endured all of that to give us what we could never earn: forgiveness of our sins, life here as dear children of the Triune God, and eternal glory with Him in heaven. Our Savior gave up His life as the only sacrifice powerful enough to cover our guilt and to guarantee our inheritance as saints.

The Baal worshipers we meet in the Old Testament and the Buddha worshipers we read about still today offer sacrifices to their gods to get on the good side of their gods. In every other religion the theme is, "*This <u>do</u> and you will be blessed!*" Christianity alone declares, "*This <u>was done</u> and you will be blessed forever!*"

That's where the *"living"* sacrifice of our body and life fits in. We don't sacrifice to earn God's love; that was already completed at Christ's cross as we will hear twice a week throughout the Lent season. As we view God's greatest act of mercy for us, we ask, "How can I ever thank You, Lord God?!" Our *"living"* sacrifice is what He asks us to do freely, daily, cheerfully. Our *"living"* sacrifice is our thanks to Him whose lavish grace provides for every needed blessing every day, and whose saving love for us at the cross gives us life forever.

As we solemnly mark the suffering and death of our Lord in the Passion season, we will be moved by Jesus' sacrifice – the enormity of it, the selflessness of it, the results of it for every sinner. We will also be moved by it to offer our every act and thought and word every hour of every day to serve and thank Him in everything.

May the Holy Spirit bless our Lent meditations at home and in His house. May He use our pondering Christ's suffering to build up in us the *"living"* sacrifice of our lives that we live for His glory and for the good of others. May He bless us as we tell others *why* Jesus died, and what it means for us and all sinners. May He bless our spiritual walk with the Savior, and bless our lives lived for Him who gave His life for us!

WELS APP Every so often we remind you about the WELS app that our Synod has developed and makes available with a free download. We encourage you to download the WELS app – and use it!

It has a church locator for your travels, daily devotions, Bible reading series, and much more!

IF YOU WILL BE AWAY FROM CHURCH and/or out of town for an extended period of time, there is a convenient way to submit regularly your thankoffering. You can instruct your bank to mail a check to *Memorial Ev. Lutheran Church / 1022 W. Grand River Ave. / Williamston, MI 48895.* When such checks arrive the mail, they are given to our thankoffering counters the following Monday. The amount is deposited into our General Fund, and the amount is noted for your account as our Financial Secretary keeps a record of all thankofferings by our members.

WHEN FILLING OUT your thankoffering envelope, please be aware of the following:

- You *don't* need to write your name on the line provided. The identifying number in the upper corner is all that our financial secretary needs.

- We ask that you *do* list the amount placed inside the envelope on the line provided for that purpose. This information is needed by our financial secretary. If you do not list it, the counters will write it in when opening the envelope.

Some members are uneasy about others seeing the amount written on the envelope as the offering plate moves across the pews. We suggest putting the envelope in the plate **face down**. That will allow you to provide the information needed by our counters, financial secretary, and treasurer, yet keep your offering amount confidential.

CHURCH COUNCIL REPORTS

PASTOR'S REPORT – **WELS news**: WELS congregations have submitted their 2019 WELS Congregation Mission Offering (CMO) commitments. To date, I've heard about the total commitments only from Michigan District congregations. Alarmingly, Michigan District 2019 CMO commitments are \$57,000 less than 2018. The WELS Synodical Council meets late this month, and will have the total 2019 CMO commitments from all WELS congregations. Based on what that number is, the SC will finalize the budget to propose to WELS delegates. That budget may include significant cuts. Join me in keeping this matter before the Lord of the Church, who remains the Lord of the Church.

Pastor Snowden Sims, Michigan District President, reports that there are 115 pastoral vacancies across WELS, about the same number as there were in January 2018. In the past year, several more Michigan District congregations are exploring different ways to conduct their Gospel ministry since they are no longer able to support a full-time pastor.

It's too early for our Synod's leaders to estimate the number of requests that WELS congregations will make for teacher graduates from Martin Luther College this spring. But what seems certain is that once again in May there will be more requests for graduates than there will be teacher graduate candidates to fill those requests.

I have discussed with the Board of Elders the proposed midweek Lent service rotation of area WELS pastors. Pastors Johnson (Our Savior – Perry), Bare and Wilde (Salem – Owosso), Franck (Prince of Peace – Howell), and I will conduct the services. With 5 pastors traveling to 4 churches, each pastor will be off for one Wednesday.

BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION – We stressed at the PTO meeting that word of mouth is the best advertising we have.

Weather delays forced postponement of the second quarter report cards being issued for a week. Mrs. Leitz applied for our 2-year preschool license. Preschool Roundup will be Wednesday, March 6, 2019

Kindergarten Roundup will be Friday, March 8, 2019.

A PTO meeting on January 14 was well attended. We discussed with parents and faculty volunteer opportunities, possibility of adding an upper grades teacher, and a third meeting April 15.

The Board of Christian Education approved the 2019-2020 school calendar.

BOARD OF ELDERS – The Elders reviewed the upcoming special services for the Lent and Holy Week season.

Our Thursday evening summer worship services will begin May 23. The Thursday evening worship service will be a preview of the following Sunday morning worship service with the exception of Thursday, May 30. That service will be an Ascension and School year closing service.

Our voice choir will resume rehearsals on March 7.

BOARD OF EVANGELISM AND STEWARDSHIP – We thank Dan Kasischke for his work distributing the 2018 thankoffering statements to our members.
