

MEMORIAL MESSENGER May 2015



"You will be My witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." After Jesus said this, He was taken up before their very eyes, and a

cloud hid Him from their sight. Acts 1:8-9

With those words of His, the risen Savior sets forth His mission and the work for His people on earth until He calls them from this life to Himself in heaven. Unfortunately, after the excitement of celebrating Jesus' rising from the dead on Easter Sunday, His people tend to settle back into the old routine of things. Our sinful, limited human reasoning suggests that if Jesus had just stayed visible on earth, people wouldn't tend to take Him so much for granted. But that wasn't His plan, nor is His power dependent on His appearing visibly to people.

Instead, His plan was to ascend into heaven forty days after He took back His life. That's good for Him; it's essential for us! Had He remained on earth for years and years after His resurrection, people would wonder why He didn't return to heaven. Maybe His work wasn't really finished at the cross and empty grave. Maybe His Father isn't perfectly pleased with His Son. Maybe Jesus doesn't have as much power as He says He has. His ascension into heaven silences all such doubts. It also fills our hearts with the confidence that His work of paying for our sins has been perfectly completed, that His Father has accepted in full His Son's payment for us, and that Jesus is in heaven preparing the place where we will live in His glorious presence forever.

His power is given in His precious good news about His work to rescue us sinners from drowning ourselves in the sea of our sin and guilt. He puts that Gospel into our hearts and on our lips and into our hands. The Savior gives us the priceless privilege of telling His good news to others. We don't have to be Bible scholars to do that. "You will be My witnesses," He said. We simply tell others what Jesus has done to save us and the world.

The ascension of our Savior was considered by believers long ago to be one of the great days of the Christian Church year. Now it's the service that has the lowest attendance of the year. What is going on in our lives on



Thursday, May 14 at 7:00 PM that is more important than hearing about what the ascended Savior means for us and about the work that the ascended Savior gives to us? The lawn can be cut another evening, the groceries can be picked up after the 45-minute service that evening.

How blessed we are that Jesus didn't say, "It's not such a good time for Me to die for sinners right now. I'm still in My early thirties. Maybe later, OK?" He spent His life here in humility for us and for our salvation. Now He is exalted in heaven to care for us and strengthen us in our walk on the path to the salvation He has won for us condemned sinners. And He uses us to talk to others about our sins and our repentance of them, about His work and our trusting in Him alone. "You will be My witnesses."

This month has a number of huge events: confirmation, Mother's Day, maybe graduation or a family wedding. But none in May is bigger than our Savior's ascension into heaven. Plan now to set aside that Thursday evening for worship. We praise Him for all that He has done and still does to bless us and save us. We grow in knowing what His will is and how to speak of Him with others. We seek His help as we serve as His "witnesses".

CHURCH COUNCIL REPORTS

PASTOR'S REPORT – WELS news: Congregation Mission Offerings for March 2-15 totaled \$1,729,000 or \$261,000 (17.8%) more than last March. Year to date, offerings have totaled \$4,229,000 or \$219,000 (5.5%) more than the same period last year. These offerings represent 103.7% of subscriptions, meaning that for the first quarter of the year offerings are 3.7% above what was projected. We are thankful to our congregations for this generous support, and we thank God for His blessings.

One of the families that visited our school for Kindergarten Roundup was made aware of our school and Kindergarten Roundup date from the ad in the *Williamston Enterprise* which a family in our congregation funded. The PTO will be asked to approve money for another ad or two about our school and preschool in May and this summer.

The new computer purchased and set up for the office secretary after the old one died in mid-March is working well. A few new software programs have been purchased, and one more will be purchased to facilitate calendar design and publishing.

BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION – Roundup days were held for preschool (March 12) and kindergarten (March 13 and another on March 20 for a child who was sick March 13). Two prospective children attended for preschool and two prospective students attended for kindergarten. Mrs. Leitz will gladly schedule sessions for parents and children who contact us this spring and summer about preschool or kindergarten for next school year.

Our school participated in the MLS Fine Arts Fair and CMLAL concert Choir in March.

Mrs. Leitz submitted the necessary paperwork to renew our preschool license, along with a check from the General Fund for \$365.00. An unannounced inspection (all preschool inspections are unannounced) was conducted by a state preschool licensing agent on March 31. Our preschool passed (with only a few minor items needing attention) and our preschool license renewal was approved, pending the Environmental Health inspection (for which the \$365.00 was needed) later this spring.

At the preschool and kindergarten roundup days last month we informed parents of prospective preschool and kindergarten students about the new immunization waiver requirements made by the state. The parents were aware of the changes and had no questions or concerns about them.

Our school has been invited to the WELS track meet for small school at the MLS track in Saginaw on Friday, May 15. Cost will be \$1 per student (for cost of awards). Pastor Voss is contacting our families about the

event. All our K-65 students will participate.

The PTO met April 15. The agenda included help with a number of special events the last month of school, as well as approving expenditures for several items—including one half of the cost for the new computer (and needed computer software) purchased last month for the office.

The board thanks Howard Clark and Kim Fedewa for their work in purchasing this computer and the new laptops in our two classrooms for the students, and for getting these machines operable for staff and students.

The board set Vacation Bible School for morning sessions to run July 27-31.

BOARD OF ELDERS – The Board of Elders recommends receiving into communicant membership here Linda Tobia by transfer of membership from Prince of Peace Ev. Lutheran Church in Howell, MI.

The young people met at church Sunday, March 22, and discussed a number of events and their participation in the June 27 Jubilee Parade. The next meeting has yet to be scheduled.

The Elders reviewed the Lent and Holy Week services.

Summer worship will resume May 24 with one Sunday morning service at 9:00 AM and Monday evening worship service at 7:00 PM. However Monday May 25th is Memorial Day and we will not have a worship service on that Monday.

BOARD OF EVANGELISM AND STEWARDSHIP – Website—A new computer has been installed in the school office. Reliability and connectivity of internet is better but slow when two computers are on line simultaneously. Jason and Kim will look into the issue in upcoming months. A new calendar program for the computer was purchased to use for the newsletter and online posting.

The bowling outing was held on April 4. The Lugnut game outing will be August 8th. We will plan a golf outing for late summer.

The Red Cedar Jubilee Parade will be June 27. The youth group has expressed interest in carrying a banner in the parade and distributing flyers for VBS and LES.

We are looking in to getting an updated quote for the new church sign.

We thank all the groups and families who volunteered to host a Lent supper.

We discussed the summer refreshment hours. We plan to continue these after non-communion Sunday services.
