# MEMORIAL MESSENGER May 2019

Like newborn babies, crave pure spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow up in your salvation, now that you have tasted that the Lord is good. 1 Peter 2:2-3



We have different tastes in physical food. But we believers in the crucified and risen Savior share one taste – we "*crave pure spiritual milk*".

Society urges people to decide for themselves what is *spiritual* for them. We're told that every idea is valuable, worthwhile, and valid. How does that fit with God telling us to *"crave <u>pure</u> spiritual milk"*? It doesn't!

We have been beneath the cross where Jesus died for us. We have been in front of the open tomb which He left. The Lent and Holy Week services we attended have been a fresh opportunity to *"taste that the Lord is good"*. He paid the price for sin that we owed. He endured the hell that we deserved. He rose from death that we might live forever. We have most certainly *"tasted that the Lord is good"*!

Now what? Now that Holy Week and Easter Sunday services are behind us, what's next? More of the same! We still "crave pure spiritual milk". That isn't some new religious idea blowing across the land. "Pure spiritual milk" is the timeless truth given by God in His Word. "Pure spiritual milk" is the forgiveness won by God in His death for us sinners. "Pure spiritual milk" is the assurance given by God in His Supper. We've "tasted that the Lord is good", and we can't wait until we get more of the rich feast that is "pure spiritual milk".

A study that's about 30 years old listed interesting statistics about <u>continuing</u> to "*taste that the Lord is good*". When Mom & Dad together regularly took their children to church through high school, 76% of the children followed in the parents' faith as adults. If only one parent worshiped with the kids, the percentage dropped to about 50%. If neither parent regularly took their children to God's house to hear God's Word, less than 10% of the children were active believers when they reached adulthood.

Those figures are earthly evidence of the divine truth that God lays on *parents* the primary responsibility to feed their children a steady diet of *"pure spiritual milk"*. Do parents want to starve children spiritually? Do believers desire to starve themselves spiritually? Of course not! But cutting ourselves off from the Word does that.



The Holy Spirit had Peter write these words to people who were rather new to the Christian faith. They had just come to trust God's salvation, had for the first time in their lives *"tasted that the Lord is good"*. Like little babies crying for more food, those new converts would continue to *"crave pure spiritual milk"*.

Nothing's changed. God's Easter gift to us is that He continues to give us His "*pure spiritual milk*". Our Easter response to the great goodness of the Lord is to keep feasting at His banquet of forgiveness – and then use that food as motivation for serving God in everything. That is God's way to keep the Easter joy alive in us as long as we live! May He continue to bless your Easter season!

On those dates there will be no specific hosts. Instead, we ask each family that heads downstairs for refreshments to bring a little something to eat, sharing it with the others who attend.

Last year the board scheduled 3 summer potluck refreshment hours. Responding to comments received last summer, the board is cutting that back to 2. The potluck refreshment Sundays are the Sunday after July 4 and the Sunday before Labor Day.

## **CHURCH COUNCIL REPORTS**

**PASTOR'S REPORT** – The following eighth grade students from our congregation will present themselves for communicant membership on Confirmation Sunday, May 5: Breanna Arntson and Sophia Staffeld.

WELS news: CMO receipts through the end of March across WELS total nearly \$4,200,000 (compared to \$4,250,000 at the same time in 2018), and the CMO for that period of time is \$107,110 ahead of pro-rated subscriptions by WELS congregations for 2019. Michigan District congregations have submitted \$528,140 (compared to \$446,557 through March last year), which is nearly \$115,000 above pro-rated subscriptions by Michigan District congregations. We give all the glory to our Savior God for continuing to motivate His people to support His worldwide kingdom work!

Thank you for all your help before, during, and after the funeral service to comfort the family and friends of Rex Hannewald. The funeral director was quite impressed and very grateful for all the assistance offered by so many that day. Judi, her children, and the rest of the family have also expressed their deep appreciation for all the love and support they have received from our members.

Preliminary estimates for the new hymnal's cost is \$50 per copy. If we get 100-120 new hymnals, we will need \$5,000 - \$6,000 available in 2020 or 2021. To help with that expected expense, I've discussed with the Board of Elders the last two months that we recommend establishing a Hymnal Fund.

**BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION** – *School Promotion* Two prospective Preschool families saw info on our website and Facebook page.

*Grades 1-5* Seventeen students sang at the CMLAL Choir concert. ACT materials were ordered for testing in April for grades 3-5 (10 total students)

**Pre-school and Kindergarten** All preschool 2-year license forms were completed. Our Preschool passed the unannounced inspection last month, and we await receiving the official license document. Four new children attended the Preschool Roundup on March 6. The current 4 year old preschool students attended the Kindergarten Roundup on March 8. The board approved Karla's plans to offer 4 half-day preschool sessions per week for 4 year old children.

We thank the PTO for hosting a Lent supper.

Given our current budgetary constraints, we at this time are not recommending the addition of an upper grades teacher for the 2019-2020 school year. We will revisit this annually.

**BOARD OF ELDERS** – The Board of Elders recommends the transfer of membership requested by Ron & Jan Mosher to Bethany Ev. Lutheran Church, Manitowoc, WI.

The Board of Elders recommends the establishment of a Hymnal Fund to receive funds to be used for the purchase of new hymnals when they come out in 2020 or 2021.

Dane Nichols met with the Board of Elders to discuss potential candidates to fill the position on the board that is vacant due to the death of Rex Hannewald. Several candidates were discussed and these names have been recommended to the Board of Evangelism & Stewardship for an election by the voters April 30.

The Elders discussed our congregation's web site and posting sermons online each week.

**BOARD OF EVANGELISM AND STEWARDSHIP** – The board discussed the *Opportunities to Serve* pamphlet and the final formatting updates that are needed. At our board's early May meeting we will review the final draft of both the pamphlet and the survey sheet which will go with it.

We thank all who hosted Lent suppers.

We discussed Evangelism encouragement for our upcoming Holy Week special services, urging members to invite unchurched friends, relatives, neighbors, and others to worship with us.

The after-service presentation this quarter will be done by the Board of Trustees.

Since our board is designated in the bylaws as the Nominating Committee, we discussed men to consider for filling the unexpired term of Rex Hannewald. Because that term has more than one year remaining, our bylaws call for an election (rather than an appointment). We hope to have a candidate for this quarter's voters' meeting.

**BOARD OF TRUSTEES** – Many thanks to Kendall Goetz and Larry Shipman for clearing snow off the parking lots all winter and to all those who shoveled the sidewalks.

A SignUp Genius list will be made for lawn mowing at the school. If you can sign up for 1 or 2 lawn mowings, please let Dennis Fisher know and he will send you a sign up request.

May 11 is going to be an outdoor work day for church and school.

April 19 the gym will be closed to set up the school plays which will be held May 16. Then the gym will open back up on May 20.
