

As we mark the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Martin Luther posting his 95 sentences, let's keep in mind that Luther never wanted to form a new church, but to urge his church to change teachings that were not Biblical. With that in mind, let's make sure that we don't turn our celebration of the milestone anniversary is a series of pep rallies for Lutheranism. What we Lutherans rightly treasure is the heritage of standing fast on all God's Word.

Luther grew up terrified of God. He had been taught at home and at church that God demands *"righteousness"* from us. This is most certainly true. The Lord is offended by every sin of thought, word, and action—and even by our failure to do perfectly what He commands. Almighty God threatens to damn to hell all who transgress His holy law. God makes all of that perfectly clear in His Word.

But that is not the entire revelation of God's truth. What Luther had not been taught at home or at church is that "*a righteousness from God, apart from law, has been made known…This righteousness from God comes through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe.*" Christ's holy life and His perfect sacrifice become the sinner's righteousness before God. That wonderful truth set Luther's heart free and changed Luther's life!

This *"righteousness from God"* found in Christ does no less for us than it did for Luther. The troubles we face can't take Jesus from us. Satan's accusations against us don't stand up against the Savior's sacrifice for us. We don't just hope to get to heaven; we are certain that life with God forever is ours—thanks to Jesus!

Day after day we go to the truths of God's Word. We don't do that because we are Lutherans. We do that because we need *all* that God has said. We do that to prevent being sucked into the devil's lies. We do that to learn how God wants His forgiven people to live. We do that to direct the lost to the payment by Jesus. We do that because we want others to receive from God the peace in Christ we possess by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Let's also keep that in heart when thoughts later in November turn to the Thanksgiving holiday. The greatest blessing we've received is salvation from Jesus revealed in God's Word and given to us free of charge. We give thanks to the LORD for all of that by living a life in keeping with His will as revealed in His Word.

These next days and weeks as we review the work of Luther, let's not get wrapped up in what *Luther* did. Rather, we rejoice at what *God* has done with His Word through Luther and others like Luther. We rejoice that *God* is still proclaiming His truth among us. We rejoice to hear and study God's Word regularly. We rejoice to pass God's truths on to others. We rejoice to let every part of our life be driven by what God desires.

That's the heritage we celebrate! We give thanks to God for His Word and for all the people whom He's used to preserve His truths among us—especially this: *"all are justified freely by His grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus"*!

The December 31 morning service will be part of our Christmas season celebration. The New Years' service will be that evening at 7:00. The board considered a late afternoon time for the New Year's Eve service, but decided against an afternoon service because it would be a quick turn around after the 10:00 service that morning.

CHILDREN'S CHRISTMAS EVE SERVICE REHEARSALS The children of our congregation will gather at church on Saturdays, December 16 and 23 from 9:30 - 11:30 AM. Parents, for the children are to proclaim God's Word on Christmas Eve in word and song effectively, their attendance at these rehearsals are very important. We expect all children of the congregation to participate in the service (from those who attend the pre-school level of our Sunday School through children who are in 8th grade.)

## **CHURCH COUNCIL REPORTS**

**PASTOR'S REPORT** – *WELS news:* The report about WELS Congregation Mission Offerings (CMO) for 2017 through the end of September wasn't available at the time this was prepared. If there is an update I'll provide it at our Council meeting. As you'll recall, CMO in our district and across WELS has been slightly ahead of subscribed amounts all year long. For that good news, we thank our gracious God!

I pray that our Church Council will recommend—and that our voters will adopt—a 2018 budget that included money for CMO to support WELS work in our country and around the world. If not for WELS mission support when our congregation was formed, and if not for WELS worker training schools, our congregation would not exist and we'd have no well-trained called workers.

Our district president reported at our pastor conference last month that WELS pastoral vacancies number about 125. That is a staggering number, and it's the result of far more pastors retiring from the ministry than pastor candidates graduating from Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary.

**BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION** – Enrollment is unchanged at 22. (preschool-5; kindergarten-5; grades 1-5: 12)

Tuition assistance requests: Two have been received and approved by the board.

We discussed a suggestion about ads in the local movie theater. The cost is significant; tabled at this time.

Debit card: The PTO treasurer will get to the bank with Pastor Voss. A document with instructions for use of the debit card will be prepared prior to its usage.

The board will be reviewing the form for requesting tuition assistance. The plan is to revise it before the 2018-2019 school year.

We discussed whether the PTO can cover the cost of software for computers in the computer room.

At the September 11 PTO meeting every family was represented. Darlene Dawley is the PTO treasurer and Katee Clark is secretary.

PTO will host the Advent supper December 6 and Lent supper February 14.

Due to Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve service schedules, there will be no Sunday School or Bible Class the mornings of December 24 and December 31.

**BOARD OF ELDERS** – An anonymous donor has purchased HymnSoft to provide music for worship services when no organist is available. To utilize HymnSoft in our worship service, we will need to hook a computer to the sound system, possibly with a dedicated computer.

**BOARD OF EVANGELISM AND STEWARDSHIP** – We discussed Facebook marketing that is currently being used for the school to advertise, and what we might want to do to promote the church with General Fund money.

We posted a slate for nominations for election.

We discussed the refreshments on the first Sunday of the month and how that went for the first one on Oct. 1. We discussed the church picnic and how that went.

The audit done of the church's financial records was received at the last Council meeting. It was part of the reports for the voters' meeting on October 24.

**BOARD OF TRUSTEES** – Pastor and Laurie cleaned all the windows at the parsonage and noted signs of wear.

Snow throwers will be ready for use when the snow arrives.

A family donated a vacuum to the school.

Furnace system will have new filters installed.

We thank our dedicated volunteers who mow.
