A restaurant tried to drum up business by posting this sign in the front window: **T-Bone:** 25ϕ

But when prospective diners got closer, they saw this in much smaller print beneath it: with meat: \$12.95

Many people seem to think that Biblical Christianity is a fine print religion. They agree that the message up front is clear: "Jesus Christ died for you!" But they try to add to that message, as if their salvation requires something more. They believe that there's something in fine print about which God doesn't tell us up front when it comes to salvation.

When sinners die, why should the holy God welcome them into heaven? Because they've tried hard to please Him? Because they did a lot of work for the church before they died? Because they read the Bible faithfully?

Those answers are adding fine print to the message of salvation which God proclaims in a banner headline throughout His Word: *Christ has died to take away the sins of the world!*

Martin Luther grew up in a religious world that had been adding false fine print to God's truth about heaven. That false fine print read, "You must please God with your works to make up for some of your sins." The young Luther was constantly worried that he hadn't done enough to please the Lord. But the Holy Spirit showed him the truth and taught Luther to erase that false fine print and to hold tightly to God's truth the rest of his life.

As we observe the Reformation at the end of this month, we do so to thank God that there is no fine print on His plan to save sinners. What is proclaimed up front is all there is to it: *Sinners are saved freely by the undeserved love from God displayed in the life and death of Christ!* There's nothing we have to do to be saved, nothing we can do to be saved. Even the faith in Christ we possess is nothing we worked in ourselves; God has given that to us, too, as an undeserved gift.

As we observe the Reformation, we don't praise Luther. He was a sinful man whom God used to highlight the truth that we are saved by grace alone through faith alone as revealed in Scripture alone. Grateful to God that Jesus has done all to save us, we rededicate ourselves to studying His truth and proclaiming His truth to others.

A wonderful way to *begin* this month of worship is inviting friends or loved ones to come with us and see the free gift of salvation that is ours in Jesus—no strings attached, no hidden charges, no fine print. We'll see you in God's house, and we'll look forward to meeting your friends who come with you, October 5!

FRIENDSHIP SUNDAY Our Ladies Fellowship group is planning a meal at our school gym, with activities to follow, for *Sunday, October 5* following the late service. The ladies, along with our Board of Evangelism & Stewardship, are promoting the day as a way for you to invite friends and relatives to our service that day to be fed with the good news about our Savior, then to have a meal and enjoy some time with us in the afternoon.

Our Bible Classes have been studying how we can begin spiritual conversations with those who don't have a church home, what the Savior wants us to tell them about Him and His work, and overcoming obstacles to speaking about the Lord.

We'll begin a new Adult Instruction Class later in October, inviting prospects from our Friendship Sunday to study God's Word with us.

<u>COME FOLLOW ME</u> Come Follow Me, the WELS Evangelism movie that our Bible Class viewed before Easter, is being offered by our Synod at a bulk rate. When 100 copies of the DVD are purchased at one time, the cost is just \$200 (instead of \$15 for one DVD). Our congregation has ordered 100 of the DVDs, and the shipment has arrived.

Like the *Road to Emmaus* DVD a few years ago, we are offering *Come Follow Me* to you for \$3 (or 2 for \$5). Asking you to pay a little more for the DVD would allow us to give away the DVD to worship visitors and prospective members. Consider purchasing copies of the DVD to give to relatives, neighbors, and friends.

<u>THE NEXT QUARTERLY VOTERS MEETING</u> is *Tuesday, October 28 at 7:00.* Each year at the October meeting we elect officers and board members (those terms begin January 1), as well as adopt a budget for the next calendar year. After the Church Council meeting in October, we will have a proposed 2015 budget ready for consideration by the voters.

An open forum for all members will be held at 11:35 on *Sunday, October 26* as reports and the proposed 2015 budget are presented for discussion. If Pastor Voss has your email address, he will send those reports to you by email on Friday, October 24.

Men at least 18 years old who are not yet voting members of the congregation and who would like to become voting members should speak to President Dane Nickols or to Pastor Voss about how to do so.

LIVE NATIVITY UPDATE After the fall festival, we will be posting informational sheets on the bulletin board in the upper part of the narthex. We ask that you sign up wherever you can help. Our committee chairs need to see who signs up so we know if we have enough members helping. We don't assume that the same members will help each year that is why <u>we need to you sign up each year</u>.

This year we will be adding a wood-working shop to our marketplace. If you have tools that you think might be good for our display, please speak to Ron or Jan Mosher. CHURCH COUNCIL REPORTS

PASTOR'S REPORT – The WELS Benefit Plans Office has posted 2015 rates for the WELS-VEBA health insurance plan. The family plan with a \$400 deductible is \$17, 436 for the year (\$1,453 per month), an increase of \$1,632 (\$136 per month) from the 2014 rate. The announced 2015 pension rates are \$2,800 per year (\$700 per quarter) per full-time worker, up \$304 from the 2014 rate. Any changes in the kind of plan or in the deductible for 2015 health insurance must be made during the month of November 2014.

As reported last month, we'll send out letters in mid-October to people who are prospects for the next Adult Instruction Class. We hope to add a number of prospects after our October 5 Friendship Sunday.

Attendance at the summer evening worship services averaged 16 this summer.

At Michigan District meetings earlier in September it was noted that though WELS congregations have increased 2014 Congregation Mission Offering (CMO) commitments by \$500,000 the past few months, WELS leaders are concerned about the relatively flat CMO over the past few years. In the past, special gifts to WELS (for example, at one time the Schwan Foundation was giving up to \$17 million annually to WELS, this year it's just \$2 million) have helped offset the relatively flat CMO. Now our leaders are making plans to adjust July 1, 2014-June 30, 2015 spending if 2015 CMO commitments don't increase by the 4% approved by delegates at the 2013 WELS Convention. We'll hear more about this, and other WELS reports, at our September 29-30 pastoral conference. We meet at Good Shepherd Ev. Lutheran Church in Beaverton.

BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION – Enrollment: Preschool-0; Kindergarten-4; Grades 1-5:11. The day before classes began on August 25 the board met after church to accept 2 applications for kindergarten students. Mrs. Leitz received two phone calls about preschool during the first week of classes.

The board approved one family's request for reduced tuition for the 2014-2015 school year.

Internet access at school is spotty due to a poorly functioning modem.

Because the WELS Christ Light curriculum for Lutheran Elementary Schools and Sunday Schools is being updated and current books will no longer be available, our budget for 2015-2016 will need to include more money for ordering the new teacher and student books. The teacher books are reusable; most of the student materials are not.

The board finalized plans for the September 8 Family Night meal and PTO meeting.

Since only two families have indicated interest in after-school care, and then only on a sporadic basis, the board has not officially offered anyone the position of after-school care provider. Should families tell us that they'll make more regular use of after-school care, we'll approach members more formally to hire staff.

BOARD OF ELDERS – The Board of Elders began researching alternatives for worship services when the pastor is on vacation and a guest preacher cannot be secured.

Plans are underway to organize a young people's group. Initial plans are to include children K-12th grade, broken out into smaller groups by age. The initial meeting will be Sunday afternoon September 28 at our school. We thank our volunteers for their work in organizing this.

The Board of Elders reviewed the summer Monday night worship services and intend to maintain the Monday night services next summer.

BOARD OF EVANGELISM AND STEWARDSHIP – The board had further discussion about the content and format of Bible Classes in September as we highlight and encourage Friendship Evangelism among our members.

Pastor Voss updated the board on a preliminary meeting for plans to get our children (K-8th grade) and young people in high school and college together on a regular basis.

Plans were made for the September 7 church picnic meal and activities.

The board heard more details about options and prices on two different styles of exterior church signs. Based on feedback from the board, more information will be sought from representatives of church sign companies as we prepare a cost estimate for the voters to consider in October.

The board discussed men to contact about church officer and board positions that have terms expiring on December 31.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES - Several families helped out the weekend before school started for clean up and repairs.

Nonskid paint on the ramp at church – Our board is in favor of painting the entire walk way.

If anyone has or sees a new or used 2 cycle snow thrower, our board is currently looking into having one at the church so the ramp area can be cleared of snow and throw the snow all the way to the parking lot.
