

"The grass withers and the flowers fall, ... but the Word of our God stands forever." Isaiah 40:7-8

We check milk containers, bread packages, and restaurant coupons carefully for the date stamped on it. Even with chemical preservatives, milk and bread stay good only for so long. And who wants the embarrassment of being told at the front of a line of fast food customers, "You can't use this coupon. It's expired!"?

But there *is* something that lasts forever, that does not expire: God's Word and each human soul. That's no coincidence. The God who authored the Word and the God who has made each person has seen to it that there is a crucial connection between the two. That connection is what Christian education is all about.

The people of Isaiah's day didn't know about refrigeration for milk or plastic in which to store bread or discounts on meals with a piece of paper. So the Holy Spirit had Isaiah contrast what happens in nature with what does *not* happen to His Word or to the crown of His creation. By mid-October the grass around here will stop growing, the flowers will have been killed by fall frost, and leaves will fall like colored snowflakes. But there's never a season when God's Word disappears. It's not just the main content of the Word that will remain; *every single word* of the Word will endure forever!

Think about that. The verses we read, the passages we study, the lessons we teach our children are what our parents and grandparents and great-grandparents have read and heard and taught! And even if we were foolishly or absent-mindedly to throw God's Word out the window of our life, it still won't fade or fall or disappear. In His wisdom and power, God will see to it that His Word is preached and taught elsewhere until He comes again.

If His Word contained only weather charts or sports scores or stock market figures, the claim that it will never disappear wouldn't excite us. But His Word tells all about our sin and its punishment, about His plan of salvation and its fulfillment. When God tells us that He has forgiven our guilt through the work of His Son, we can count on it. Since God's Word teaches that only those who trust in Jesus will be saved, that all who reject Jesus and His work will be damned, that is the way it is and always will be!

Some disagree. They say, "A loving God would never condemn to everlasting fire the people whom He made!" That may make sense to their view of things, but the unchanging God says differently. Scholars scoff at the thought that man will live forever in heaven; it doesn't fit what they see with their eyes. But, again!, the greatest Scholar of all has decreed that there eternal life with Him for all who die trusting Jesus as their Savior.

Man isn't a cardboard box to serve a purpose for a while, then be thrown away. We aren't biodegradable blobs that one day will only return to the dust we came from. God has made us with a body and a soul to live forever.

The Christian education efforts that are resuming among us are centered on the answers to life's biggest questions. "What happens when a person dies? How do I get to heaven? What does God want from me and my life?" God answers those questions in His Word.

Will we shrug off Bible study this fall, figuring that we've heard it all before? Dare we be indifferent about something so vital and eternal?! Join us in class. Bring your little ones to their classes. Stay in regular contact with the Word of Life, which stands forever. Make that the top priority for you and your family! *Pastor Voss*

CHURCH COUNCIL REPORTS

PASTOR'S REPORT: We will send letter regarding another Adult Instruction Class shortly after Labor Day. If you know of prospects for the class, please let me know, and speak to them about the class. Why not offer to come to class with them?!

Kristen Schlicker began studying the truths of God's Word in Thursday evening sessions starting in early July. Her husband Colin is taking the class with her as a review.

Attendance at the summer Monday evening worship services: 10, 5, 5, 14, 18, 12 (through August 3). I appreciate the understanding of our members about the fact that services were not held on four Monday evenings (Memorial Day, Michigan District Convention, and 2 vacation dates this summer.

We are very grateful to our organists who have been so generous with their time in volunteering to play for both the Sunday morning and Monday evening services.

The last summer evening worship service will be held Thursday, September 3 (not Labor Day evening, September 7). The service will be the same as the service on the following Sunday.

After trying a number of things to improve our school internet network reliability, Jason Leitz suggest that we contact Comcast to see if they provide internet service to our school address. Our office secretary contacted Comcast. The man with whom she spoke had Laurie run a speed test. That test showed our current download speed with Frontier is 2.92 and upload speed is 0.74. Comcast provides 25 for download and 10 for upload.

BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION REPORT: Enrollment projection for 2015-2016 school year: We anticipate the enrollment to be preschool is 4, kindergarten 4, grades 1-5 is 10 or 11.

ELDERS REPORT: The organ schedule for July through November has been prepared and distributed. The Elders thank our organists, choir, choir director, choir accompanist, chime choir, and other musicians for using their God-given talents to beautify our worship services.

As recommended by the Synod, the Elders have discussed and are recommending the adoption of a policy regarding marriage. The Doctrine and Policy Regarding Marriage for Memorial Ev. Lutheran Church will be distributed in mail boxes.

BOARD OF EVANGELISM AND STEWARDSHIP REPORT: We will look into what paying Google might do to get our church and school listed in the top 10 results when people search for church and schools in Williamston.

Since only two were present at the meeting, we did not decide on a date—or any other particulars--for the dinner we will host for the community. Those present felt that wider participation by the board is necessary for such decisions.
