In this age of social media, many people check Facebook, Instagram, Twitter—and check such social media several times a day. They want to see what their family, friends, and favorite celebrities are posting.

What if the Lord used Facebook or Instagram or Twitter? What if He posted from heaven something important for us to read every day, every hour on one of those forms of social media? We'd check that out, wouldn't we?

But we don't, do we? I realize that the Triune God has never posted anything on any social media outlet. But He does publicize the fact that He has given us something eternally important to read every day. He does desire that we let His Word "dwell in us richly" (Colossians 3:16).

Do we? Do we turn to Holy Scripture as eagerly as we await something new about the grandchildren on Facebook? As often as we look for something exciting from a classmate on Instagram? As interested as we check for controversial comments from an actor on Twitter? Or do we excuse our lack of attention to God's Word with a casual, "I've read it before and I still know what it says!"?

This month Christian Education efforts in our congregation are in high gear again. We'll resist Satan's temptations to consider Bible Class, Sunday School classes, Catechism Class, Adult Instruction Class, ChristLight instruction, and other classes as just programs offered by our church and school—programs we can either take or leave without any particular blessing or harm. Such sessions are opportunities to study God's unchanging truth, to get His direction for every situation every day, to hear His desires for our lives, to review His plans and work to save us sinners.

Jesus describes Himself as "the Word". What we read on the pages of Holy Scripture is what our Savior says to us. We are told that "the Word became flesh". Jesus lived what He said, fulfilled what His prophets foretold, and completed the mission which is the focus of the Word, His Word: salvation for every sinner.

We all want a closer walk with God. But a closer walk with the Almighty doesn't happened by sitting on a sand dune or watching an eclipse or weeding the garden. The Savior draws near to us in His Word where He exposes our sinfulness and the hell we deserve, then reveals His forgiveness and the heaven He opens.

No one needs Facebook or Instagram or Twitter to survive. But no one can survive forever without the Word dwelling in them. Send your children or grandchildren to our school and to Sunday School. Study God's Word with us in Bible Class. Consider attending the next Adult Instruction Class for a thorough review of God's truth. We go daily to the Word to hear what the Savior has to say. Let that become a regular part of your daily life!

CHURCH COUNCIL REPORTS

PASTOR'S REPORT – When school starts, I will resume Adult Instruction Class sessions with the mother of two students in our school / preschool. Should other prospective members be interested in studying God's Word, I'm eager to start classes with them, too. Please let me know if you are aware of anyone to contact about these classes.

WELS news: Through the first 7 months of 2017, WELS has received \$11,305,439 in Congregation Mission Offerings. (Receipts were about \$400,000 less through the same period in 2016.) That amount is more than \$225,000 above subscription amounts. From Michigan District congregations, \$1,153,263 has been received, which is \$20,000 more than last year at this time and is right at the subscribed amount.

Attendance at the summer Thursday evening worship services June 8 – July 27: 11, 10, 10, 58 (pot luck meal at end of VBS week on June 29 and at school), 21, 14. We are very grateful to our organists who have been so generous with their time in volunteering to play for both the Sunday morning and Thursday evening services.

Thank you for covering the cost of registration for my serving as a delegate to the WELS Convention last week. It was wonderful to hear firsthand about the work that's being done around the world by our Synod, and to be part of planning that work for the next two years. The delegates adopted a ministry financial plan for the next two years that maintains current levels of WELS work, adds several full-time positions in WELS approved two years ago, includes a 3.5% increase in fixed costs, and will use some reserves. The delegates did so, urging every congregation in WELS to increase CMO support of the work because the Lord of the Church is opening a number of unexpected doors to bring the good news of salvation through faith in Christ alone to those who do not yet know Jesus. At the convention WELS received into doctrinal fellowship three small church bodies: one in Ethiopia and two in Asia.

Convention delegates viewed the WELS Martin Luther movie Return to Grace. As you read in the report from our Board of Evangelism & Stewardship, we are seeking information from the WELS producers of the movie about hosting a showing of the movie in our area this fall.

Some internet connection problems continue at school. Our thanks to Kim Fedewa for his work to try to resolve them. We hope to have dependable internet access on several computers in the computer room when the school year begins August 28.

BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION – Enrollment for 2017-2018 is projected at: preschool: 5-7; kindergarten: 4-6; and grades 1-5: 12-13

Targeted Facebook marketing promoted VBS and school from June 14-20. Statistics showed 32,663 local impressions, 16,288 people reached and 37 links clicked. The total cost was paid by PTO at \$104.96.

Flyers were distributed at the July 22 Art Fest and August 1 at National Night Out. The board thanks those who staffed our booths at both events.

Aides have been approached about serving this year.

Two new volunteers will head school hot lunch planning for the 2017-2018 school year.
