


MEMORIAL MESSENGER September 2019



"I am against the prophets who wag their own tongues and yet declare, 'The Lord declares.'... Let the prophet who has a dream tell his dream, but let the one who has My word speak it faithfully. For what has straw to do with grain?" Jeremiah 23:31,28

It's a rhetorical question. When the LORD asks, "What has straw to do with grain?", the answer is obvious.

Or is it? To Old Testament Jews at the time of Jeremiah who very much agriculturally-aware, the answer was obvious. But is it to us? We know that heads of grain form on top of stalks, and when the stalks are separated from the grain, the stalks become straw. So it might seem to us that grain and straw have *much* in common.

That's the wrong conclusion. "What has straw to do with grain?" Of the two, only grain nourishes man and animal. After the harvest, straw is good for nothing more than to make a bed for beasts. Living beings don't eat straw.

The LORD made that comparison in the middle of a section of His Word that warns against false prophets. Israelites who knew better than to confuse the nourishment of healthy grain with hollow straw were confusing the ranting of lying religious people with the saving truth from God. That was a recipe for spiritual disaster and damnation!

Not much has changed in the centuries since Jeremiah. Aren't many people these days ready to believe any religious thought they hear, as long as it sounds nice and is at least a little bit reasonable? The ideas that the LORD presided over millions of years of evolution, that God approves of any sexual relationship between two people in love, that Jesus is just one of many ways to heaven are a few examples of dreams promoted by false prophets today. People listen to those teachings and believe those lies because they sound good to them.

We know what the LORD says about His creating activity, about God-pleasing sexuality, about Christ's sacrifice as the only payment for sinners. We believe all of that because God says so, not because some preacher says so. How do we know what God says? We read *His* Word in Holy Scripture.

This month we resume structured Bible study in our congregation. Our various classes aren't held to make us look busy as a congregation. They are held in our church and school buildings because we all need to know what God does for us, and because we all need to grow in our understanding of His truths. Thus strengthened, we are equipped to speak for God from His Word to others. Thus renewed, we will not be such easy prey for the devil's lying prophets who want us to believe the tempter's latest lies.

Join us in Bible Class. Invite an unchurched friend to worship with you, and then to come with you to a Bible Instruction Class the pastor will be delighted to have with your friend – and you. Set aside time as a family to be in the Word at home. God uses His Word of life about Christ to build us up. What a blessed result for us! What a privilege to be used by Him to reflect His Light to others! We have the truth; let's use it! *Pastor Voss*

CHURCH COUNCIL REPORTS

PASTOR'S REPORT – I have been meeting with a retired husband & wife from Fowlerville who have been worshiping with us since Easter Sunday. I will discuss with the Board of Elders what the couple's wishes are regarding joining our congregation as communicant members and what further instruction, if any, is needed to get to that point.

WELS news: The delegates to the WELS Convention two weeks ago re-elected Rev. Mark Schroeder as WELS President. They also adopted the 2-year budget proposed by the Synodical Council (SC). Every WELS congregation is strongly urged to increase Congregation Mission Offerings (CMO) so that our church body can maintain and expand work to spread the Gospel of the Savior to all the world – the mission which the Savior has held before His Church since the day He ascended into heaven.

Thank you for agreeing to cover my costs for the Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary class I took at MLS in Saginaw the end of June. The detailed study of the Greek text of 1 Peter was very beneficial, as was the opportunity to refresh translation principles and skills.

Michigan District meetings will take me out of town from Tuesday morning, September 3 through Thursday evening of that week. As a result, three of our boards will have different meeting times for their September board meetings, two of them actually meeting in late August.

BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION – Several families found out about our VBS from Facebook posts and several others from the sign in front of our church.

VBS: 42 children heard the Word of God during VBS July 22-25. The Board of Christian Education thanks our teachers, helpers, and organizers.

A letter was sent to our school and preschool parents outlining the changes that will be occurring with a daycare renting rooms in the northern part of the building.

Due to changes in the building use, relocation of records and other materials, the board feels that it is necessary to restrict the use of our new library to official school / church member use only. Driver's education class and basketball teams will have to be assigned other space, likely the north end of computer room.

BOARD OF ELDERS – The Voice Choir will resume rehearsals this fall preparing for the Advent and Christmas season.

The 2020 Usher schedule is being prepared and will be distributed when it is ready. We have contacted 4 men about serving as ushers.

The MLS Concert Choir will present God's Word in song here Sunday, April 5, 2020. To better accommodate the Choir, we will have only one service that Sunday at 10:00 AM with no Bible Class or Sunday School.

BOARD OF EVANGELISM AND STEWARDSHIP – About 45 Opportunities to Serve surveys have been returned. Our office secretary is tabulating our members' responses and will supply boards with database information for the work / volunteer opportunities under the respective boards.

We discussed the upcoming September 8th church picnic. Join us!


We will address the congregation, having an after-service discussion with our members about the feasibility of our congregation presenting the Live Nativity early this December.
