BOXTOPS FOR EDUCATION: This year Boxtops for Education has started a new way to collect these credits for our school! They hope this program will be easier for families. Please refer to the informational sheets given to you at registration about how to set this up for you and our school. For each one we collect we receive \$.10 which we can use for our school in any way. Go to BTFE.COM to learn more about these changes. The information is also posted on the lobby bulletin board or you can ask in the office for the sheets if you have misplaced yours.

If you still have Boxtop labels, please send them in to school by OCTOBER 15 so we can send those in and get credit. We thank Dianne Steiner for being our coordinator for the boxtops program.

ANOTHER NEW PROGRAM we want to participate in earns no money for school but does greatly help the environment. *Crayola ColorCycle* is the name of this program. Through this initiative, students in K-12 schools across the continental United States and parts of Canada can collect and repurpose used markers.

Crayola ColorCycle will accept all brands of plastic markers, not just Crayola markers. That includes dry erase markers and highlighters and daubers! ColorCycle will eliminate placing hundreds of tons of markers into landfills.

Bring your used and dried up markers to school. Place them in the box marked Crayola ColorCycle in Mrs. Domke's classroom or on the shelf in the narthex at church. We will send them in to be recycled. Crayola pays for the shipping so there is no charge to us and we help protect the environment.
