Our thankoffering mission project this year is our Wisconsin Ev. Lutheran Synod's mission effort in Vietnam. The Lord has provided an opportunity for our church body to build a theological training center in Hanoi, the capitol of Vietnam. Ours is the first Christian group permitted by the still-Communist government of Vietnam to build a facility directly related to work with the Gospel of Christ! Our synod hopes to receive \$2 million dollars by Easter 2019 for this effort.

2019-2020 SCHOOL YEAR CALENDAR Our Board of Christian Education has approved the 2019-2020 school year calendar. It was attached with the printed copy of last week's school newsletter. If it wasn't attached to your family's newsletter, speak to Laurie or Pastor Voss about getting the calendar.

<u>IMPORTANT LETTER</u> Also attached to last week's newsletter was an important letter. Again, if you don't have that letter, speak to Laurie or Pastor Voss to get a copy of it. Here's what we put in last week's newsletter about the important letter ...

At the January 14 PTO meeting the main topic of discussion was the feasibility of adding grades 6-8 to our school. Our Board of Christian Education continues to do research about how much money that would cost and what impact that would have on the tuition families pay.

The board has prepared a letter to inform you about what was discussed at the January 14 meeting, about the tuition level our board thinks would be necessary to add those grades to our school, and to find out from you what level of tuition increase your family could afford.

Please take the time to read it carefully, and then provide the information our board is seeking. Note from the letter that it is to be returned to Pastor Voss. He will total the financial figures that our parents submit, but will <u>not</u> report to the board the individual amounts indicated by each family.

Please speak to Pastor Voss if you have questions about the letter, or matters related to it.

DAYS OFF IN FEBRUARY: Please note that there are two no school days in February on the school year calendar and the school activities calendar. Our school will be closed on

Although there is no school scheduled the next two Mondays (Feb. 18 – Presidents' Day and Feb. 25 – Pastor–Teacher Conference), it would be unfair to ask families to change plans and/or medical appointments that were made for those days to avoid time away from classes.

The Board of Christian Education will continue to discuss things with our faculty. We are committed to making sure that there is sufficient time to provide the instruction necessary to teach all that our curriculum requires for the school year.

Thank you, parents, for your understanding! Safety is the primary concern when the decision is made to close our school. We will continue to communicate with you about any make-up days that will be scheduled.

<u>LENT</u> Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, is March 6. We will have six midweek Wednesday evening Lent services. The services are at 7:00 PM.

Suppers at church are hosted by different church groups each Wednesday during Lent and begin at 6:00 (except the first one with the school families that begins at 5:45).

We invite you to come to the suppers and be fed with delicious food, and then worship with us after that and be fed with the Word of God. Join your hearts with others as we hear about what Jesus did to pay for our sins that we might have eternal life with Him in heaven.

<u>THE FAMILIES OF OUR SCHOOL</u> will help with the supper before the first Midweek Lent service at our church on *Wednesday, March 6*. The children sing for the 7:00 service that evening. The supper begins at *5:45* in the church fellowship hall.

You will receive a note about how you can help with the PTO-sponsored meal that will feed 50-55 people.

<u>PRESCHOOL ROUNDUP</u> will be held *Wednesday, March 6 from 9:30.-11:00*. If you know of a family interested in preschool for next year, please tell them about this special day and speak to Mrs. Leitz to get an invitation to give to the family.

Children must be 3 years old by September 1 to enroll for the 2019-2020 school year.
