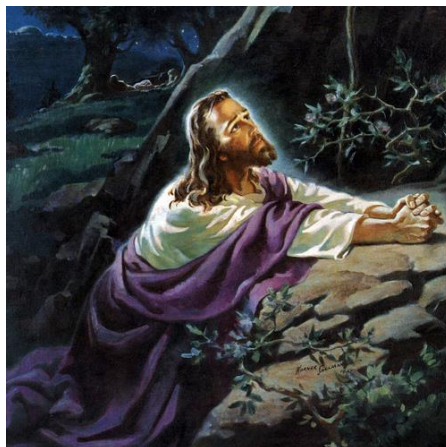
A couple students in grades 3-5 will have an opportunity to retake their chapter 7 social studies test. That opportunity will be right after school on Monday, March 25.

Our thankoffering mission project this year is our Wisconsin Ev. Lutheran Synod's mission effort in Vietnam. The Lord has provided an opportunity for our church body to build a theological training center in Hanoi, the capitol of Vietnam. Ours is the first Christian group permitted by the still-Communist government of Vietnam to build a facility directly related to work with the Gospel of Christ! Our synod hopes to receive \$2 million dollars by Easter 2019 for this effort.

Suppers at church are hosted by different church groups each Wednesday during Lent and begin at 6:00.
