<u>THE NEXT COMBINED DEVOTION</u> will be **Friday**, **March 29** (because there is no school the first week of April). We will collect thankofferings from the children at the devotion that morning. The students will receive envelopes that may be used for a thankoffering.

Our thankoffering mission project this year is our Wisconsin Ev. Lutheran Synod's mission effort in Vietnam. The Lord has provided an opportunity for our church body to build a theological training center in Hanoi, the capitol of Vietnam. Ours is the first Christian group permitted by the still-Communist government of Vietnam to build a facility directly related to work with the Gospel of Christ! Our synod hopes to receive \$2 million dollars by Easter 2019 for this effort.

LENT We have two midweek Wednesday evening Lent services remaining. The services are at 7:00 PM. Suppers at church are hosted by different church groups each Wednesday during Lent and begin at 6:00.
