GENERAL INFORMATION

<u>THE NEXT COMBINED DEVOTION</u> will be **Friday**, **May 3**. We will collect thankofferings from the children at the devotion that morning. The students will receive envelopes that may be used for a thankoffering.

Our thankoffering mission project this year is our Wisconsin Ev. Lutheran Synod's mission effort in Vietnam. The Lord has provided an opportunity for our church body to build a theological training center in Hanoi, the capitol of Vietnam. Ours is the first Christian group permitted by the still-Communist government of Vietnam to build a facility directly related to work with the Gospel of Christ! Our synod hopes to receive \$2 million dollars by Easter 2019 for this effort.

The Christian faith is based on Christ, not on us. What He did in Jerusalem the very first Holy Week perfectly completed the work we sinners could never do: pay the full penalty for all our sins. At the cross, Jesus suffered literal hell so that we won't have hell to pay for our sins.

The Christian faith is not about us, but about Christ. His life and death and rising as our Substitute is the greatest gift ever! We don't even want to think of what this life would be like without Him, not to mention the horribly unending punishment we'd suffer without Him.

That's the message proclaimed in our church this holiest weekend of the year. We hope to see you in worship with us Good Friday at 7 PM and Easter Sunday at 7:30 or at 10:30. An Easter breakfast will be served at school 8:45 - 9:45 Sunday morning.

May our crucified and risen Savior bless your family's continuing Holy Week worship!
