GENERAL INFORMATION

<u>LUTHERAN SMALL SCHOOLS TRACK MEET</u> We are again invited to participate in the WELS Small School Track Meet at the track facility of Michigan Lutheran Seminary in Saginaw on *Friday, May 17*. The event is for Grades K-8, so all our students will participate, and that will be our school for the day.

The meet begins at 9:00. Please wear your Memorial shirt. Dressing in layers may be a good idea in case the morning is chilly.

Registration has been sent. Pastor Voss spoke several times with each class about events the students wanted to select.

The event should conclude by 2:00, allowing us to be back at school by the normal end of the school day. If you have questions, please speak to Pastor Voss. Cost for participation at the track meet (\$1 per student for ribbons) will be covered by our PTO. Those attending should pack a lunch, or bring money to buy items from the concession stand.

<u>SCHOOL LIBRARY</u> The school library will be open until the end of the school year but the last day to check out new books was this past Thursday. All books should be returned by <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>May 21</u>.

Please check your home for <u>library books and classroom books</u> that should be returned. If a book is lost or damaged it will have to be replaced by the beginning of the next school year. Thank you.

WE HAVE NO SCHOOL on Monday, May 27 because of Memorial Day.

LAST DAY FOR PRESCHOOL is **Wednesday, May 29**. There will be a recognition of the Preschool students that morning. Mrs. Leitz will announce a time for that.

<u>SCHOOL YEAR CLOSING SERVICE</u> We end each school year we the way we begin it – with a worship service. The end of the school year service is held the night before the last day of school. The worship service will be held *in our church* at 7:00 PM Thursday, May 30. All students will sing for the service. (Preschool will only sing with the other grades the hymn that is the theme for the year "Lift High the Cross".) That service also celebrates our Savior's ascension into heaven 40 days after He rose from death.

<u>5th GRADE GRADUATION AND KINDERGARTEN GRADUATION</u> After the Thursday evening closing worship service, there will be a brief ceremony acknowledging the successful academic work done by our graduation fifth grade students Mason Nosis, Evie Ostrander, and Anna Reynolds.

Following the recognition of those students, we will have our annual presentation by our Kindergarten students, and mark their completion of the Kindergarten course of study.

- Kindergarten 5th Grade for non-member students: \$1,500.00 for oldest child,

\$1,250.00 for younger siblings
