<u>SCHOOL YEAR CLOSING SERVICE</u> We end each school year we the way we begin it – with a worship service. The end of the school year service is held the night before the last day of school. - Preschool 4 mornings/week for 4-year old: \$1,000.00, plus \$50.00 application fee
- Preschool 3 mornings/week for 3-year old: \$850.00, plus \$50.00 application fee
- Kindergarten 5th Grade for Memorial congregation students: \$1,000.00
- Kindergarten -5^{th} Grade for non-member students: \$1,500.00 for oldest child,
 - \$1,250.00 for younger siblings

Our Board of Christian Education will consider tuition assistance for families that desire it. Please speak to Pastor Voss to get a tuition assistance form.
