# **GENERAL INFORMATION**

**MONTHLY DEVOTION** We did have our joint devotion today. Our next one will be March 1.

Our thankoffering mission project this year is our Wisconsin Ev. Lutheran Synod's mission effort in Vietnam. The Lord has provided an opportunity for our church body to build a theological training center in Hanoi, the capitol of Vietnam. Ours is the first Christian group permitted by the still-Communist government of Vietnam to build a facility directly related to work with the Gospel of Christ! Our synod hopes to receive \$2 million dollars by Easter 2019 for this effort.

**<u>SINGING IN CHURCH</u>** – The students will sing at the beginning of the 10:30 service **this Sunday**, February 10. The students should be in the church fellowship hall at 10:15 (right after Sunday School) to practice the song.

<u>ICHD</u> – The technician from the Ingham County Health Department was unable to conduct hearing tests for our students last week. When the new date is determined, we will let the parents know.

**<u>2019-2020 SCHOOL YEAR CALENDAR</u>** Our Board of Christian Education has approved the 2019-2020 school year calendar. It is being attached with the printed copy of this week's school newsletter.

**IMPORTANT LETTER** At the January 14 PTO meeting the main topic of discussion was the feasibility of adding grades 6-8 to our school. Our Board of Christian Education continues to do research about how much money that would cost and what impact that would have on the tuition families pay.

The board has prepared a letter to inform you about what was discussed at the January 14 meeting, about the tuition level our board thinks would be necessary to add those grades to our school, and to find out from you what level of tuition increase your family could afford.

The letter is also attached to this week's paper copy of school newsletter. Please take the time to read it carefully, and then provide the information our board is seeking. Note from the letter that it is to be returned to Pastor Voss. He will total the financial figures that our parents submit, but will <u>not</u> report to the board the individual amounts indicated by each family.

**<u>CHOIR CONCERT</u>** The annual sacred concert by students from seven Lutheran Elementary Schools will be *Friday, March 8* at 7:00. It will be held at **Christ Ev. Lutheran Church & School** north of Oakley. The church and school property is on M-57, a few miles west of the intersection of M-52 and M-57. The intersecting road is S. Hemlock Road. The children will rehearse music at *6:30*.

<u>MLS FINE ARTS FAIR</u>: This year's Fine Arts Fair for students in grades three-five will be held at Michigan Lutheran Seminary on Saturday, March 2. It's time to talk to your child about what they will do for that fair and then start to prepare for the competitions and projects. Because of the number of snow days, we have moved the date that applications and money should be turned in. Please have that to Mrs. Domke by Monday, February 11<sup>th</sup>. (The only two categories for which grades 3-4 may enter are the art and forensics competitions.)

Keep this in mind, you only have to go to MLS if you are participating in music, forensics, math, or spelling. Students participating in science and art need only to have their work to our school by Tuesday, **February 26**. That work will be transported to MLS by one of the teachers. Those projects will then be brought back to school at the end of the fair. You are still encouraged to attend and see all the entries and listen to the other competitions. IT REALLY IS A LOT OF FUN!

Students will be charged an entry fee of \$2.00 for each category and entry he/she enters. For example: If a student enters a science project, two art projects, and does the spelling bee, there would be a total entry fee of \$8.00. If your child wishes to participate, please ask the teacher for an application. These applications and the money must\_be **turned in by Monday, February 11<sup>th</sup>** so we can have them sent in on time.

After your application is turned in, your child may request more detailed instructions for the event(s) in which he/she has entered. We encourage you to read these instructions carefully so there are no disappointments on the day of the fair.

If you have any questions, please ask any teacher. We will give you the schedule for the day as the date gets closer and when we receive individual times for those students who need them.
