<u>CROSS COUNTRY</u>: There was a cross country meet for Lutheran Schools students in Grades 3-8 Wednesday. Participants from our school were Michael Labadie, Joshua Leitz, David Thomasma, and Anthony Labadie. The meet was held at the DeVries Nature Conservancy on M-52, just north of Owosso.

Pastor Voss apologizes for the late notice about the event. It was put together rather quickly when things became a little clearer about sports in our state during the precautions that are in place.

There will be another cross country meet <u>Wednesday, October 14 at the same site</u>. It will also be for students in Grades 3-8 at our area Lutheran Elementary Schools.

The races will begin at 5:00, with the youngest students running first. 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> graders run 0.5 mile. 5<sup>th</sup> graders run 1.0 mile. Please speak to Pastor Voss if you desire more information about the <u>October 14</u> event.

<u>WE HELD OUR FIRST</u> emergency drill of the school year this week – a fire drill on Thursday. We follow the guidelines set by the state for the frequency and timing of emergency drills: 5 fire drills, 3 lockdown drills, and 2 tornado drills.
